



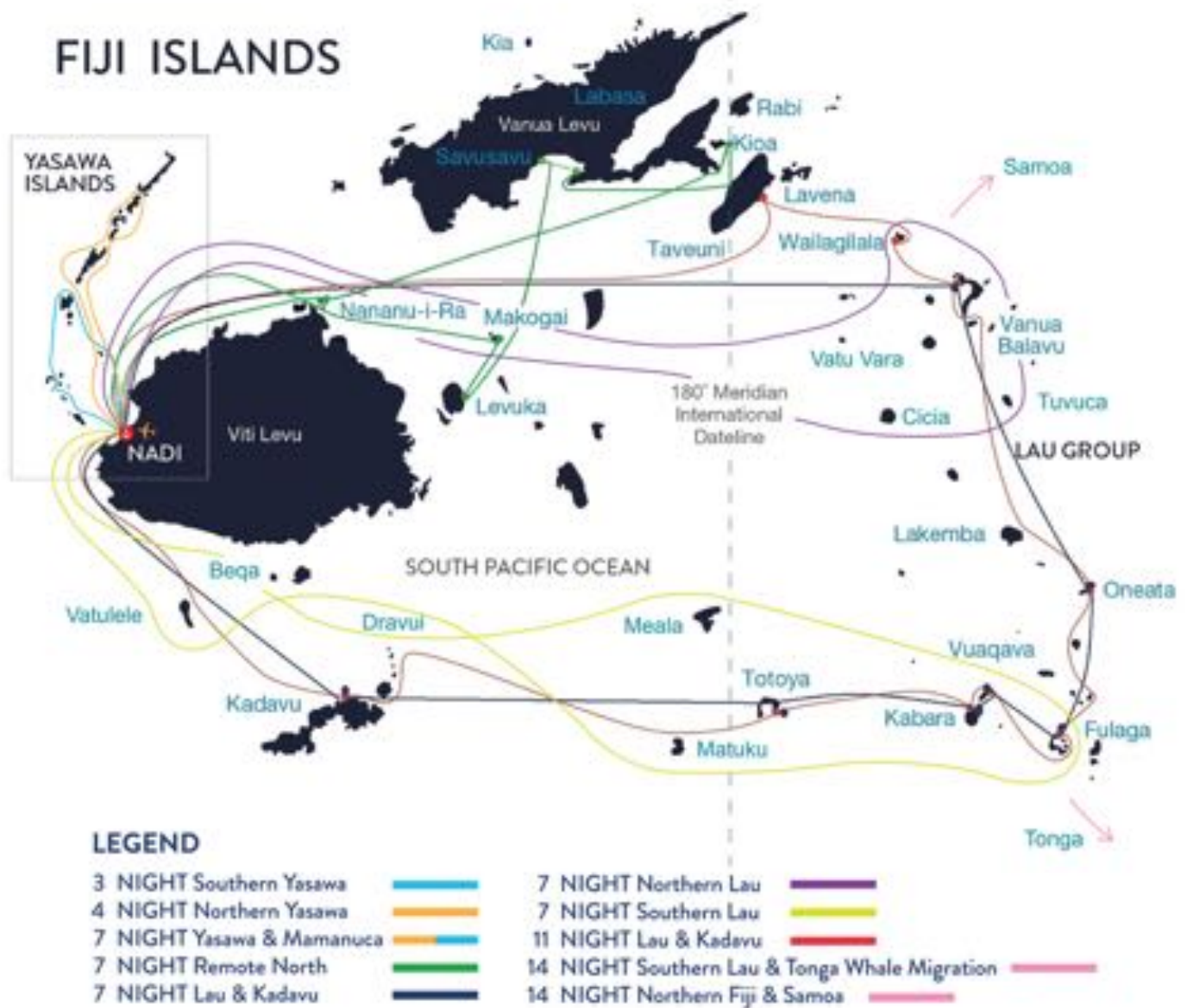

Day 2. Monuriki Island

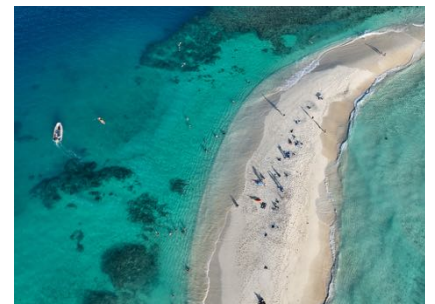
## DAY 1. NUKU-I-MANA

Set sail over lunch through the beautiful Mamanuca islands before arriving for a snorkel and experiencing the vista of a South Pacific sunset. Later join the Captain and crew for the Welcome Dinner.



## DAY 2. MONURIKI ISLAND & MONU BAY

Sail to idyllic Monoriki where Tom Hanks' Castaway was filmed. Explore this natural film set and idyllic Monu Island before a special village choral service. The beautiful harmonies will simply delight you. Later be entertained with our Fijian Fashion Show and crew choir.



## DAY 3. SACRED ISLAND & WAYA ISLAND

The Sacred Island is a place beautiful beyond belief. Legends tell of the great war canoe 'Rogoboka' which landed here with the first Fijians. On arrival the ship's crew pay tribute to the forefathers and perform the Sevusevu (gift giving) ceremony. Spend a magical morning swimming in the aquamarine lagoons, snorkeling in spectacular coral gardens, beach combing or coral viewing from the glass bottom boat.

Over lunch cruise to the Southern Yasawa islands. Enclosed by towering volcanic peaks and palm fringed beaches, Waya Island is a tropical paradise. Visit a local school, a village and shell market or climb to the peak of Waya for amazing views. Don your favourite island attire for Pacific Island night!

## DAY 4. DENARAU MARINA

After breakfast, return to Denarau Marina for a 9:00am disembarkation.

Day 3. Sawa-i-Lau



## DAY 1. TIVUA PRIVATE ISLAND

Ni sa Bula' is the magical call of welcome as you board. Cruise to Tivua Island over a light lunch and explore the coral gardens, clam rearing cages or a scenic walk through the island before enjoying a South Pacific sunset. Later join the Captain and his crew for the Gala Captain's Dinner.

## DAY 2. BROTHERS ISLAND & NAVITI ISLAND

Start the day with a morning swim & snorkel in an idyllic bay at Brothers Island.

Savour a gourmet buffet lunch as we journey to Naviti Island with aquamarine waters and white sandy beaches. Snorkel, swim, kayak, stand up paddle board or just explore the island. Then join the festivities and entertainment of a Fijian Village at Gunu for a traditional Fijian Feast (Lovo) and Cultural performance (Meke).



## DAY 3. SAWA-I-LAU, BLUE LAGOON & YASAWA ISLAND

Discover the legendary grandeur of Sawa-i-lau and the famous limestone caves. Swimming in the cave lagoon is a wondrous experience.

Visit a local school for a memorable experience and then snorkel over spectacular coral gardens, swim in fabled lagoons or test your fitness with a climb to the peak of Mt Tamasua. Later try your luck at crab racing.

## DAY 4. YAQETA & DRAWAQA

Cruise the soaring volcanic peaks of the Yasawas, discover the myriad of fish in the coral reef and laze in the warm sands of Yaqeta.

During lunch cruise the spectacular channels to Drawaqa for amazing snorkelling, you may even see a Manta-ray (seasonal). Later get your dancing shoes on for the Famous Captain Cook Cruises Music Quiz.

## DAY 5. DENARAU MARINA

After breakfast, return to Denarau Marina for a 9:00am disembarkation.

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# 7 NIGHT REMOTE NORTH FIJI



## DAY 1. TIVUA PRIVATE ISLAND

Welcome aboard with a complimentary fruit punch and welcome salusalu (lei) as we set sail for our Fiji Island adventure. This afternoon we visit our own exclusive island “Tivua” where you can enjoy a twilight swim, snorkel or relax on the beach. A great place to refresh your scuba and snorkel skills and then enjoy our special Welcome Dinner and Crew Introduction.

## DAY 2. MAKOGAI ISLAND

Passengers are invited to attend a special choral performance of Sunday Hymns from the children of Makogai. We will then explore the pristine waters of Makogai Island with a snorkel or glass bottom boat tour to experience the clam research station here. Later there will be an opportunity to join the 1 hour walking tour of Makogai’s historical graveyard and old leper colony.

## DAY 3. LEVUKA

We arrive at Ovalau and the port of Levuka, situated off the northeast coast of the main island. Levuka was the first European settlement in Fiji and became the centre of British colonial administration and trade. At its peak over 50 hotels catered to the thirst of sailors in port and the town gained a wild reputation. In 1888 the capital was moved to Suva on the main island, and Levuka’s notoriety gradually waned. Passengers are invited to join an optional tour of this now quiet historic town. In the afternoon we have snorkelling and a shipwreck tour or explore the town.

## DAY 4. SAVUSAVU

We arrive at the second largest town on the second biggest island in Fiji, Vanua Levu. Explore the town and its hot-springs or visit the world-famous Justin Hunter pearl farm. This afternoon we visit Whispering Tide for swimming and snorkelling with our Marine Biologist

## DAY 5. TAVEUNI ISLAND

We disembark on the western side of the “Garden Island” of Fiji. The optional bus tour takes you to the beautiful Tavoro Waterfall in the Bouma National Park. Swim and relax in the beautiful setting or take a challenging hike to the 2nd & 3rd falls. After a picnic lunch at the national park, we return to the ship or our crew will take you to the famous natural Dateline (180th Meridian) where you can literally stand with one foot in the past and one foot in the future. Later we visit Naselesele Village to enjoy the tastes of Fiji with a traditional ‘lovo” (earth oven) feast where we share fresh local seafood, succulent meat and tropical fruits before dancing to the drum of the meke(dance) and kava ceremony.

## DAY 6. KIOA ISLAND & VIANI BAY

Kioa Island was settled by the people of Tuvalu Island (also called Ellice Island) after they were displaced by rising sea levels. Be met by these colourful people in their traditional way and see their vibrant cultural presentation.

Cruise along the south coast of Vanua Levu over lunch to our afternoon anchorage of Viani Bay for snorkelling and the beach. This evening we have a white theme so join in by dressing in white for an amazing atmosphere plus don’t forget to don your dancing shoes on for the famous Captain Cook Cruises Music Quiz.

## DAY 7. NANANU-I-RA

Cruising south west from Vanua Levu we arrive at Nananu-i-ra on the northern coast of Viti Levu for our customary swim, snorkel and beachcombing. There may also be an opportunity to hike the hill. After lunch there is our last opportunity ashore before we begin our homeward journey. Don your favourite island attire and join all the celebrations of our Pacific Island Night Finale.



# 7 NIGHT ULTIMATE LAU



Day 3. Qila Qila

## DAY 1. TIVUA PRIVATE ISLAND

Set sail on your Lau Discovery cruise over a light welcome lunch. After boarding there will be a full safety briefing from your Captain while we sail to our private island of Tivua, a great place to refresh your snorkelling skills. Later in the evening, enjoy a wonderful Welcome dinner as you cruise into a south pacific sunset.

## DAY 2. MAKOGAI ISLAND

Start your day at Makogai Island with a traditional Fijian ceremony before joining the 1 hour walking tour of Makogai leper colony and clam research station. The people of this remote village welcome us for church.

## DAY 3. QILA QILA

Qilaqila, at the northwest end of Vanuabalavu, is known for its pristine waters, limestone caves and mushroom shaped islands. This is also known as the Bay of Islands and is famous for its amazing scenery and pristine reefs.

## DAY 4. FULAGA ISLAND

We arrive at Fulaga Island this morning. Both are extinct volcano craters and known for their crystal lagoons and amazing corals. This afternoon we arrive at one of the Yagasa Islands, for snorkeling, swimming, coral viewing or kayaking..

## DAY 5. VUAQAVA & KABARA

Explore uninhabited Vuaqava and its central lake known for turtles, snakes & amazing bird life. This is a sacred island for the Fijian culture and there will be an island walk to explore these relics. Please be warned that a reasonable level of fitness and good walking shoes will be required as the return walk is approximately 3 hours and quite difficult to negotiate. The beach here is also gorgeous for those who prefer to relax. We heave anchor and travel over lunch to our next destination.

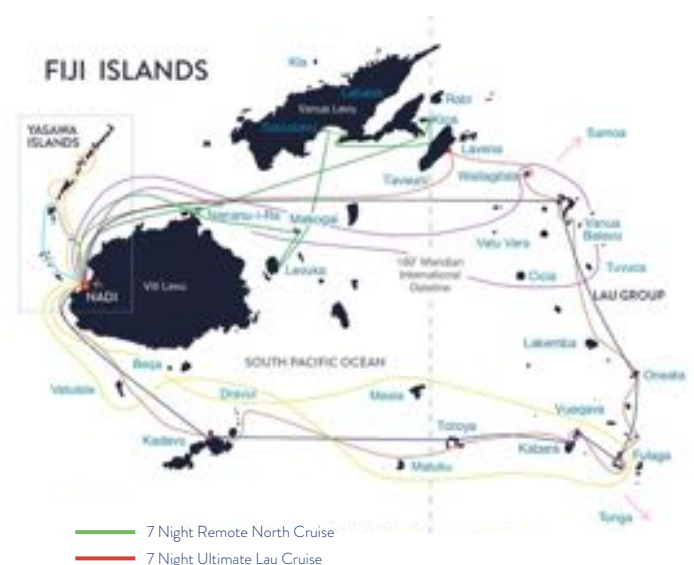
This afternoon be welcomed & entertained by the people of Naikeleyaga Village on the island of Kabara known for their wood turning and Tongan heritage. Experience a traditional Meke, Sevusevu & lovo quite different from the traditional Fijian. Don't forget your bula shirt and sulu for a traditional lovo dinner on the island.

## DAY 6. TOTOTOYA ISLAND

Horse-shoe shaped Totoya Island is our destination today. We will visit a local school and the children will surprise you with their entertainment and show you their work. We will also have the opportunity to explore their reefs.

## DAY 7. KADAVU

We arrive in Kadavu and head to the Village of Nalotu for a welcome Sevusevu, then a tour of the village where you can witness the making of traditional fishing traps and pottery. The women of Nalotu village still make clay pottery in the time-honoured tradition that is rarely seen in Fiji anymore. This evening don your sulu (sarong) and join all the celebrations of our Pacific Island Night Finale.

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# 7 NIGHT NORTHERN LAU



Day 3. Vatu Vara



## DAY 1. TIVUA PRIVATE ISLAND

Enjoy an afternoon of beach activities at Captain Cook Cruises' own Tivua Private Island. As you explore the beautiful coral gardens of Tivua you'll be surrounded by magnificent aqua waters and 500 acres of coral gardens. Paddle, snorkel, dive to explore or join our sustainability journey by planting a coral in our coral nursery while you're there.

## DAY 2. MAKOGAI

Discover a fascinating piece of Pacific history on your locally guided walking tour through the jungle. You'll explore the ruins of a former leper colony and snorkel over giant clam gardens in the island's turtle sanctuary. Back onshore, you'll have the opportunity to join the island's church service and be entertained by the local villagers and children with their traditional song and dance.

## DAY 3. VATUVARA

Today you'll explore one of Fiji's most beautiful marine parks at Vatu Vara. This majestic island rises out of the Pacific with a 305-metre-high summit, giving it the nickname 'Hat Island'. The volcanic and limestone island is just three kilometres in diameter and home to both a bird sanctuary and a National Park. Vatu Vara is also home to the world's largest land arthropods, the coconut crab.

## DAY 4. WAILAGILALA

Today includes a discovery of its seabird nesting colony and marine ecosystem that makes it a nationally significant island. Literally translated as "no water or rain", Wailagi Lala is famous for crystal-clear waters and many say that the tiny atoll is the only true atoll in Fiji. Dominated by a 1909 cast iron lighthouse (now abandoned and reaching some 29 metres in height) the sand island is surrounded by spectacular lagoon and coral reefs. Feel chalky white sand between your toes as you explore paradise.

## DAY 5. QILAQILA & MAGO ISLAND

On today's visit you'll encounter hot springs and have a chance to swim in crystal-clear waters amidst a labyrinth of mushroom-shaped rock formations and islets. Spot an endemic Fijian free-tailed bat as you explore and swim through the easily accessible caves.

Enjoy lunch onboard as we steam towards Mago Island. On today's visit you'll have the opportunity to visit the cult village, Namalata. The reefs around Mago Island are diverse and pristine, making diving a must-do.

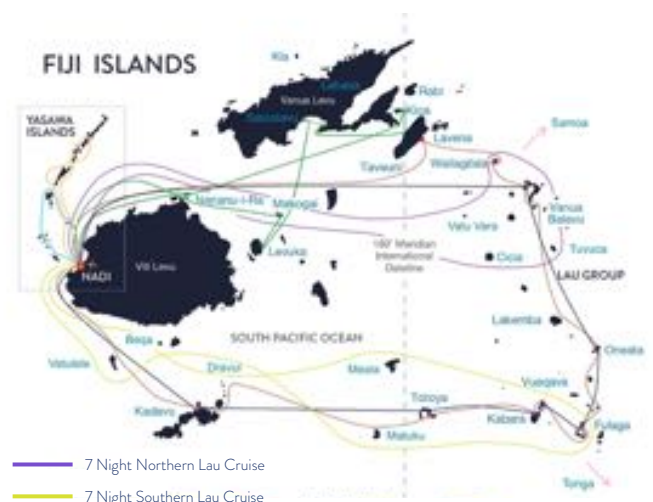
## DAY 6. LAKEBA

Discover interesting historical sites and Chiefly Village on a guided tour. Key figures in Fiji's political history including Ratu Sukuna and Ratu Mara are buried here as are the remains of the Tongan King and conqueror of much of the Lau, Ma'afu. Next follow the path of explorer Captain William Bligh who travelled in his 12-foot boat from Tonga through Lomaivit to Vatu-I-ra.

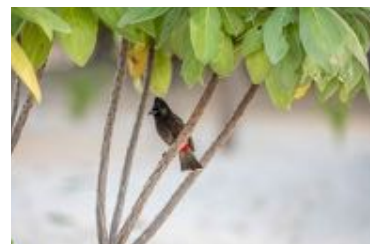
## DAY 7. VATU-I-RA & NANNAU-I-RA

Natural beauty surrounds you in this large conservation park where you'll enjoy Vatu-i-ra island as well as explore the large surrounding barrier reef. The island is a haven for breeding seabirds, earning it the nickname "Bird Island". Dolphins, whales, sea turtles and more than 100 species of fish populate the diverse marine ecosystems surrounding the island

Today we'll visit the northern coast of Fiji's largest island Viti Levu for our customary swim, snorkel, beachcombing or possibly take a hike. After lunch we go ashore before we begin our homeward journey. Don your favourite island attire and join all the celebrations of our Pacific Island Night Finale.



# 7 NIGHT SOUTHERN LAU



## DAY 1. THE GREAT SEA REEF

Before the sun sets, take an afternoon snorkel, swim or dive on the third largest reef in the world, the Great Sea Reef. Settle into a sunset cocktail and enjoy a welcome dinner on board as you are introduced to the crew.

## DAY 2. BULIYA

Buliya is Fiji's fourth largest island whose villages and residents are discovered on a guided hike with our ship's crew. Later complete a refreshing ocean swim or take a book and laze on its magnificent white sandy beaches. There's a chance to swim and snorkel with serene manta rays in Buliya's pristine shallow waters and for divers, the world's fourth largest reef Great Astrolabe is calling!

## DAY 3. MATUKA

Between 1840 and 1853 when Ma'afu was trying invade the island, the Cakobau (King) of Fiji was protected on Matuku by the people and ultimately returned to his home island of Bau. Evidence of the fierce battles remain including ring ditches and war fortifications from the era can be found around the island. Highlights include joining a guided hike to discover the island's history and visit Lomati, one of its five villages.

## DAY 4. FULAGA & YAGASA

Fulaga is an extinct volcano crater and is famous for its crystal-clear lagoons, colourful tropical fish and vibrant corals. You'll have a chance to swim in this magnificent aqua blue paradise and meet local villagers who'll be happy to welcome you to their home and share their traditionally crafted woodcarvings and handicrafts.

We arrive at Yagasa Island for snorkelling, swimming, coral viewing and kayaking. Snorkel around the magnificent collection of coral bommies rich with diverse and abundant marine life and beautiful coral gardens.

## DAY 5. VAQAVA & KABARA

Come ashore on the chalky white beach of this uninhabited and sacred island of Vuaqava. A beautiful, guided hike through the lush vegetation leads to the centre of the island where an inland lake - known for its resident turtles, snakes and amazing bird life. It's a great spot to have a swim or just enjoy the tranquility. When you return to the island's shore you may be treated to a locally prepared delicacy of coconut crabs.

This afternoon you'll be welcomed and entertained by the people of the Naikelayaga Village on the island of Kabara. Known for its wood turning and Tongan heritage, Kabara is famous in Fiji as the home of wood carving. Experience a traditional Meke, Sevusevu & lovo here which is quite different from most you will find in Fiji.

## DAY 6. TOTOYA

Today's island visit heads to the tiny horse-shoe shaped Totoya Island with its deep-water volcanic crater. The high reef surrounding Totoya makes it a popular boating destination with its fascinating water passages and it's also home to a world-famous surfing break. We visit a local school and the children will surprise you with their entertainment and be proud to show you their work. We'll also have the opportunity to explore the local reefs for some outstanding diving and snorkeling.

## DAY 7. VATULELE & BEQA

A beautiful aquamarine lagoon surrounds Vatulele offering fabulous snorkelling and extraordinary dive sites. Vatulele is the most famous place in Fiji for the craft of tapa, the traditional bark cloth. The ladies of the village share their knowledge and teach you how it is done. Exploring the island, you'll discover the sacred and protected red prawns.

The story of firewalking in Fiji begins around 500 years ago on the island of Beqa, when there were only around 50 people living in the village of Nakarovu. Legend says the special firewalking powers are specific to the descendants of Tuinaiviqalita. Beqa also offers the opportunity to dive with sharks and a chance to book in for an optional sport fishing experience.

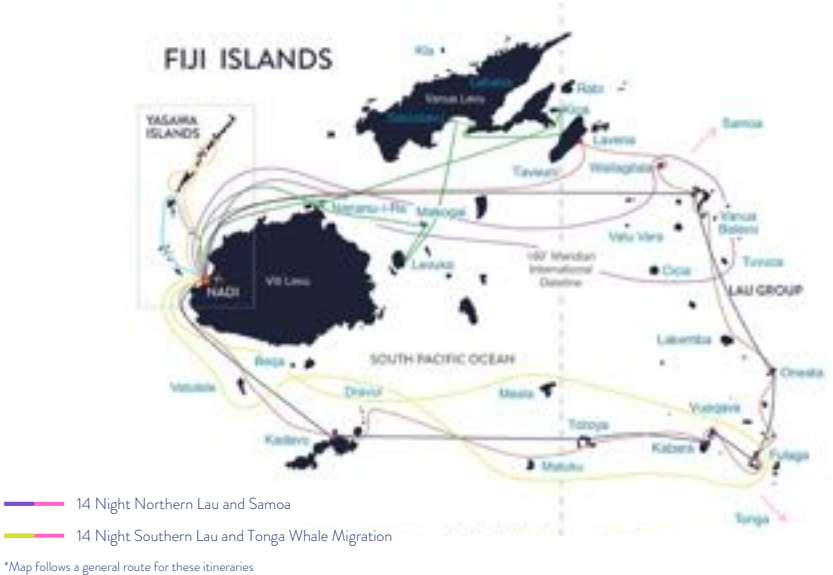

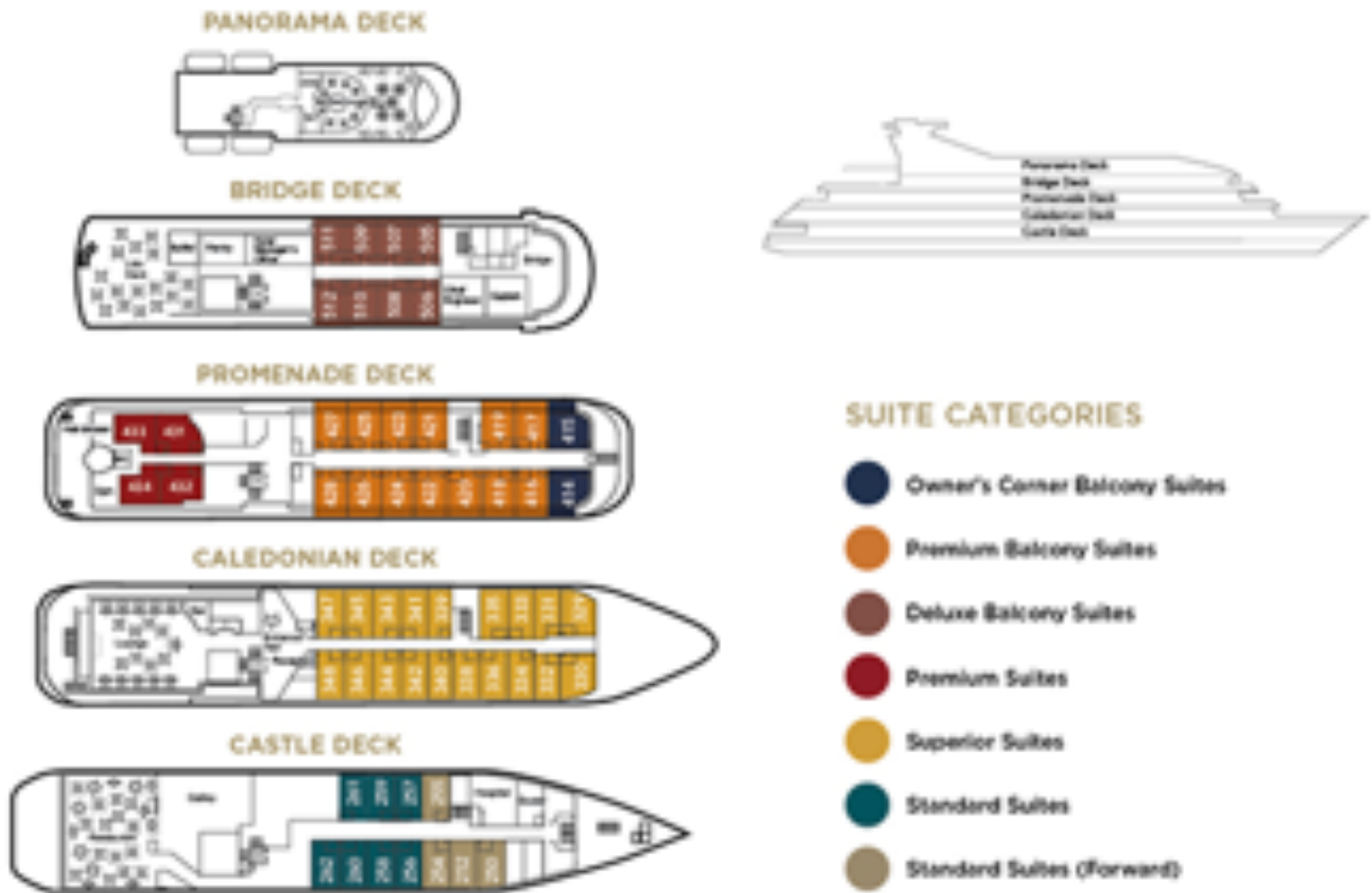

When your booking/ticket is confirmed, it will be deemed at all times that you have read, understood and accepted the conditions hereof, and agreed to the terms herein contained. Attention is particularly drawn to the Company's right to exemption and limitation of liability.

1. **THE CONTRACT:** Upon payment of the fare for the agreed cruise described on the passenger ticket and the Company's brochure and subject to the other terms of this contract, Captain Cook Cruises agrees to accept the passenger or passengers named in the passenger ticket.

2. **DEFINITIONS:** (a) "Passenger" means anyone buying the passenger ticket or using it as a passenger, or anyone named on the ticket. (b) "Carrier" includes the Company and the vessel named on the passenger ticket, her owners, charterers and operators, any substituted or connecting vessel and all launches and vehicles belonging to the vessel or owners or operated by any of the above. The Company is not a common carrier. (c) "Sea" means the waterways of the Great Barrier Reef, Murray River, Fijian Islands, Sydney Harbour or such other places as the Carrier may from time to time select. (d) "Sailing" shall mean and include the time the passenger embarks on his/her cruise until the cruise is completed.

3. **GENERAL PROVISIONS:** (a) Your authority to agree. In buying the passenger ticket you state that you are authorised by or on behalf of any passenger listed on the ticket (including any minor) to agree to all the terms of this contract. (c) No third party responsibility. This contract is only with the Carrier. No other person or Company shall be responsible in any way to the passenger. (d) Limitations apply if third party is held responsible. However if any other person or Company is held responsible, all benefits, limitations, exemptions from liability, defences and immunities referred to in this contract or under law or treaty or from any other source apply to such persons or Company and their vessels, agents, servants and employees. (e) Contract continues. This contract remains in effect for all periods when the Carrier is under any responsibility to the passenger or the passenger's property. (f) No oral changes. No addition, variations, or waiver of any of the printed terms of the contract can be effective unless it is expressed in writing and signed by the Carrier or its Authorised Agent. Any changes must refer to the passenger and ticket Number. Any waiver by the Carrier of any of its rights under this contract, or failure to assert or enforce such right cannot affect any other rights of the Carrier.
