More than 1 in 3 women and 1 in 4 men in the United States have experienced rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in their lifetime 2

44% of lesbian women and 61% of bisexual women in the U.S. experience rape, physical violence, or stalking by an intimate partner, compared to **35%** of straight women<sup>2</sup>

**26%** of gay men and **37%** of bisexual men in the U.S. experience rape, physical violence, or stalking by an intimate partner, compared to **29%** of straight men <sup>2</sup>



Survivors who are people of color and immigrants face greater challenges accessing support services. A 2019 survey found that 3 out of 4 advocates reported that immigrant survivors fear accessing legal services related to their abuser

The National Network to End Domestic Violence (NNEDV) defines financial abuse as "...behavior that seeks to control a person's ability to acquire, use, or maintain economic resources, and threatens their self-sufficiency and financial autonomy..."
