Connecting Communities, Giving with Dignity, Creating Opportunities

ounded in 2009, Grassroot Givers has been making the connection between those in the Capital Region who lack basic essentials for daily life—housewares, clothing, personal care items, books and more—and those who have these likenew resources to share.

Without these essentials, even the most basic activities can be a struggle: preparing meals without dishes, pots, or pans; encouraging children to go to school or play outside without warm coats and boots; or sparking a child's interest in reading without access to books in their home.

At our facility on Washington Avenue in Albany, our dedicated staff and team of volunteers help us sort and organize clothing, housewares, and books from our generous donors to help ease those struggles and create opportunities for local families.

Everyone who walks through the door at Grassroot Givers feels welcome. Donors visiting Grassroot Givers are grateful that their cherished personal, family items are finding a new home and helping local families move forward. Those coming to Grassroot Givers in need of basic necessities feel

valued. We work closely with each person, to ensure they receive exactly what they need. Our shelves are neatly stocked with quality, like-new home goods and clothing. Our books are displayed and categorized similar to a retail bookstore. Children's books are rated for reading level, using the city school district's system, making it easy for teachers to choose books for their students.

Each year, as we have expanded our programs, our donations from the community have grown along with us.

Partnered to Support Every Family

We partner with more than 130 businesses, schools, and regional nonprofit organizations that assist our neighbors living in poverty. These families are often living paycheck to paycheck, transitioning from homelessness, or are refugees creating a new home in our community. In 2021, we joined Healthy Alliance, a network of more than 500 health care providers and community-based organizations that collaboratively support vulnerable people. These partners refer individuals to Grassroot Givers, where they can request the exact items they need, completely free of charge.


Grassroot Givers by the numbers:

- Traveling book bikes—a whimsical, eye-catching mobile library which allows us to share diverse books out in the community.
- General sharing of books to day cares, Albany public and charter schools, other nonprofits, Schenectady County Jail, the Albany Airport, and many other venues.
- Sharing books gives families the tools to build literacy, empowering children and adults alike, including those with English as a second language.

A Message from Our Co-Directors

rassroot Givers has come a long way since we helped our very first family who lost everything in a house fire in 2009. The community not only answered the call, the outpouring of support was enormous. This sparked the idea to open a small store where people could choose the basic necessities they needed, all of which would be completely free. In 2011, Grassroot Givers added the Book Project, recognizing the need for books in the home to support literacy for all.

From these beginnings, our tiny venture has grown into a lifeline for thousands of our neighbors. Our philosophy remains the same: we provide people with the resources they need to start a new chapter in their lives—giving them the tools to stabilize their lives, to bolster literacy, to promote economic equity, and to support the dignity that every person deserves.

We are fortunate to witness the impact our work has on a very personal level: the joy of a child who holds a new book in her hands, perhaps the first she has been able to call her own; the smile of a mother setting the table for a family meal she has just prepared; the comfort a teenager feels, sleeping in their own bed with fresh linens after transitioning from a shelter; and the confidence of a man who is now wearing the professional clothing he needs for his job interview.

As our programs continue to grow, it allows us to give even more to all who need this simple helping hand. We are so thankful to our community for their dedicated support and spirit of sharing. We humbly ask you to join us as we plan for the future.

Increasing Our Community Impact

Each year, more and more individuals and families in our community need the support that Grassroot Givers provides as requests from our partners at schools, shelters, and community programs are increasing. In order to expand our programs, as well as our space, we need to increase our revenue to keep up with the demand.

- We require more space to take in, sort, organize, and display our home essentials, clothing, and books. Currently, our lack of space severely limits the amount of out-of-season goods we can accept, and additional items are often stored offsite, out of necessity.
- Each of our programs is expanding to meet the increasing need. This requires more volunteer support and more staff, which is crucial to the success of our model.

With the increased rent, utilities, and renovations, we will more than double our current expenses. We have hired additional staff and will invite more volunteers to help us manage our programs. To meet these challenges, we are launching our \$500,000 Support our Community Impact Initiative, appealing to our community for philanthropic investment in our mission, thereby increasing our capacity to serve.

- Upgrade our computers and increase our technological capabilities.
