PREVALENCE OF ELDER ABUSE

The World Health Organization defines elder abuse as:

a single, or repeated act, or lack of appropriate action, occurring within any relationship where there is an expectation of trust, which causes harm or distress to an older person.



1 in 10 older Canadians experience some form of mistreatment each year.



Elder abuse is often **under- reported** due to stigma,
shame and fear. Rates of
elder abuse are likely higher.



According to the first Global Report on Ageism, **1 in 2 people** globally are ageist against older people.



In 81% of cases, it was a spouse, family member, friend, neighbour, or acquaintance causing the harm.



Financial abuse is the most well-known form, but mistreatment can also be physical, emotional, sexual, or neglect.



There are only **13 emergency** and transitioning shelters for older adults across Canada.
