A free and confidential service that helps Hoosiers find the local resources they need - Food, Housing, Goods, Transit, Health, Money, Care, Education, Work, Legal.	<u>Health Clinics in Indiana - Free and Income-Based</u> - Most clinics listed in this database receive federal grants, state subsidies, or are owned and operated by non-profit organizations and provide services that are either free or at a reduced rate.
<u>Counseling Resources</u> - The Counseling Center at the Crossing Inc. offers professional counseling with a Christian perspective. Licensed Christian counselors are available to listen to you and offer real hope when you are struggling with life's toughest issues.	<u>Homeowners Refinance Assistance - Marion County - Indy Affordable Modification Program (IndyAMP)</u> – This program allows Marion County homeowners who have been negatively affected by COVID-19 to refinance mortgage debt at a below-market interest rate for up to 30-years. IndyAMP allows owners to remain in their homes, become current with their mortgages and lower their monthly payment.
<u>Dental Clinic - Indiana University School of Dentistry</u> Quality dental care at an affordable cost while you help prepare the dental professionals of the future.	<u>Interview & Work Clothing - Dress for Success Women's Style for Success Program</u> – The Style for Success Program provides women with clothing for a job interview or new job. <u>Food Pantries - Marion County</u> - Listing includes food pantries as well as information on food closets, food banks, soup kitchens, congregate meal locations, food boxes, vouchers, etc.	<u>Legal Assistance - Indianapolis Bar Association - Indy Lawyer Finder</u> – Indy Lawyer Finder is a FREE service that connects you with the Indianapolis-area attorney who best meets your legal needs!

Click on the 'Interest Form' button on that web page and complete the information on the form.</p>	<p><u>Legal Assistance - Indiana Legal Services (ILS)</u> – ILS is a non-profit law firm that provides free civil legal assistance to eligible low-income residents throughout the state of Indiana. Areas where ILS can help include housing, consumer advocacy, education, families & children, seniors, health, public benefits, taxes, immigration, veterans, LGBT assistance.</p>
<p><u>Legal Assistance - Neighborhood Christian Legal Clinic</u> – Free legal services to those who cannot afford them. Their goal is to free their clients from the legal burdens that have kept them from flourishing. The Clinic has offices in Indianapolis and Fort Wayne, but they also provide services statewide.</p>	<p><u>Stephen Ministry at Church at the Crossing</u> – Stephen Ministry provides confidential, one-on-one Christian care to people who are experiencing a difficult time in their life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, relocation, or separation due to military deployment.</p>
<p><u>Mental Health - Key</u> – A mental health consumer-run organization – an organization of people in recovery. Empowers others to find their mental and physical health, unlock their full potential, and embrace recovery with hope, dignity and courage.</p>
