

FSC Policy Statement

Commitment to FSC Values

It is the policy of Euroforest Ireland not to be directly or indirectly involved in the following activities:

- Illegal logging or the trade in illegal wood or forest products;
- Violation of traditional and human rights in forestry operations;
- Destruction of high conservation values in forestry operations;
- Significant conversion of forests to plantations or non-forest use;
- Introduction of genetically modified organisms in forestry operations;
- Violation of any of the ILO Core Conventions.
- Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work, 1998.

We are also committed to:

- abolition of child labour, elimination of all forms of forced or compulsory labour, elimination of discrimination in respect of employment and occupation, respect of freedom of association, and effective recognition of the right to collective bargaining;
- adopting and implementing policy statement(s) that encompass the FSC Core Labour Requirements;
- demonstrating compliance through certification with other social certifications;
- giving an option for other organizations such as certification bodies to submit certification schemes which comply to the FSC Core Labour Requirements, and incorporating a risk-based approach via self-assessments in which organizations describe how they apply the requirements to their operations.
