Working as an EMT and Doula in North Carolina has significantly inspired this work


Defining the Issue

The pandemic has led to significant loss —of **lives**, **jobs**, **housing**, **access to healthcare**, and more.

In April 2020, the **total number of cancer screening tests** through CDC's National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (Early Detection Program)

- declined by 87% for breast cancer
- declined by 84% for cervical cancer
