Volunteer Spotlight: Chris Coker, Attorney at Law



We often say that volunteers are the lifeblood of our organization. From helping out at our senior centers to delivering Meals on Wheels, volunteers are at the forefront of keeping us running smoothly. This month, though, we are thrilled to profile someone who helps out very much behind the scenes. Chris Coker, Attorney at Law, is a senior partner at Younglove and Coker, PLLC. He volunteers his time to provide pro bono legal work to Senior Services for South Sound.

How did you first learn about Senior Services and when did you begin your service as a volunteer?

I've been aware of Senior Services as an organization for a very long time, however I did not know specifically what kinds of programs they offered, or the extent of the area and people they served. My law office, Younglove & Coker, PLLC, has been offering volunteer legal services to the organization since approximately 2021.

How do you volunteer? What do you do?

The law office provides a variety of pro bono legal services/advice to the Senior Services organization to help it navigate legally, which in turn allows it to focus on providing more direct services to its clientele.

What about volunteering in your capacity do you find rewarding?

Many of the legal issues Senior Services encounters are somewhat complex and can span several areas of law. It is rewarding to be presented with a question from Senior Services staff, analyzing and breaking down the issues, then working with staff to craft the best response/policy/practice moving forward.

What is your understanding of how your particular volunteer efforts benefit the organization?

Beyond offering pro bono legal services to the organization, I hope the legal services my office provides gives the organization piece of mind knowing that it has a relationship with a law firm that it can contact anytime when needed.

What is something people don't know about your volunteering that you think worth sharing?

When the lawyers in a law firm offer their legal services on a volunteer basis to an organization, it isn't just the lawyers volunteering their time, it is also the entire firm's staff that volunteer their time as well.

SMP (Senior Medicare Ptrol) advises people to be smart

about sharing their Medicare number

Your Medicare number is sensitive information and just as valuable as a bank account number. The SMP advises that you not share your number with anyone except health care providers, insurance companies, or health plans (and their licensed agents or brokers). You can also safely share it with people who work directly with Medicare, like the SMP. Care Connection

Care Connection provides people, aged 60 and above, with an affordable, trusted and reliable place to turn to when needing a variety of assistance – housekeeping, companionship, personal care support, dementia-specific needs, personal assistance, end of life care/hospice and more.

When you receive a referral of an Independent Provider (caregiver or housekeeper) on the Care Connection registry, you receive a qualified, skilled Independent Provider who works directly for you and with you, not a franchise or corporation.

Independent providers are screened and interviewed. Care Connection checks references, runs a Background checks including a sex offender's sweep. Independent providers must provide Care Connection their Washington State business license, current CPR certification, current malpractice insurance coverage and current driver's license in order to be referred to clients.
