





HOW TO RUN THE BIG ANTI-BULLYING ASSEMBLY: AN EDUCATOR'S GUIDE

As students all over the UK return to schools and lessons, join us as we come together, welcome one another back for a new academic year,

and remind everyone of the need for mutual respect in our schools and communities.

Together, we will pledge to put an end to bullying, celebrate diversity and create communities of kindness.

KEY DETAILS

When: Monday 3rd October

What: Your young people will hear from a host of celebrities on why anti-bullying is so important, as well as practical tips to take away and immediately implement in your school in order to make it a kinder place built on mutual respect where difference is celebrated and bullying behaviour is stamped out. Our celebrity friends and special guests will cover a variety of topics, including the importance of being an 'Upstander' against bullying behaviour – someone who doesn't just stand by when they see something that isn't right.

How to take part: As long as you've signed up via our website you will receive an email a few days before the 3rd October with a link to preview the assembly ahead of sharing it with your students on the 3rd. The video will continue to be available on our YouTube channel so your classes can watch and get involved at a time that's convenient for you.

Who is this for: The Big Anti-Bullying Assembly is suitable for all Primary School students

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

All you need is access to the internet, a screen large enough for all pupils to view comfortably and the link (which we will send a few days in advance). That's it! You may like to test your video and sound system in advance to ensure smooth viewing. The video will be a YouTube link so it may be worth checking with IT to make sure YouTube isn't blocked or behind a firewall at your school.

HOW TO INTRODUCE THE ASSEMBLY

Returning to school for a new academic year can be challenging for many young people, particularly if they have witnessed or experienced bullying behaviour in school previously, so it's important that young feel supported. If you would like to introduce The Big Anti-Bullying Assembly to young people before tuning in via the link, you could speak about how it's ok to have mixed feelings about being back in school. Some young people may be excited to see their friends again and some may be worried or anxious about what the new school year will bring. But by coming together, welcoming one another back and reminding everyone of the need for mutual respect in our schools and communities, your young people will make a flying start.





HOW TO INTRODUCE THE ASSEMBLY

You may also like to speak to your young people about The Diana Award, the only charity set up in memory of Diana, Princess of Wales, and her belief that young people have the power to change the world. Ask your young people if they agree that 'young people can change the world' and how they want to create positive change in school. It could be by being a friend to someone who looks lonely or by helping their teacher tidy up at the end of the lesson. There are lots of ways that young people can create a positive school culture. Princess Diana believed that young people had enormous potential to do good – how do your young people plan to create positive change this year?
