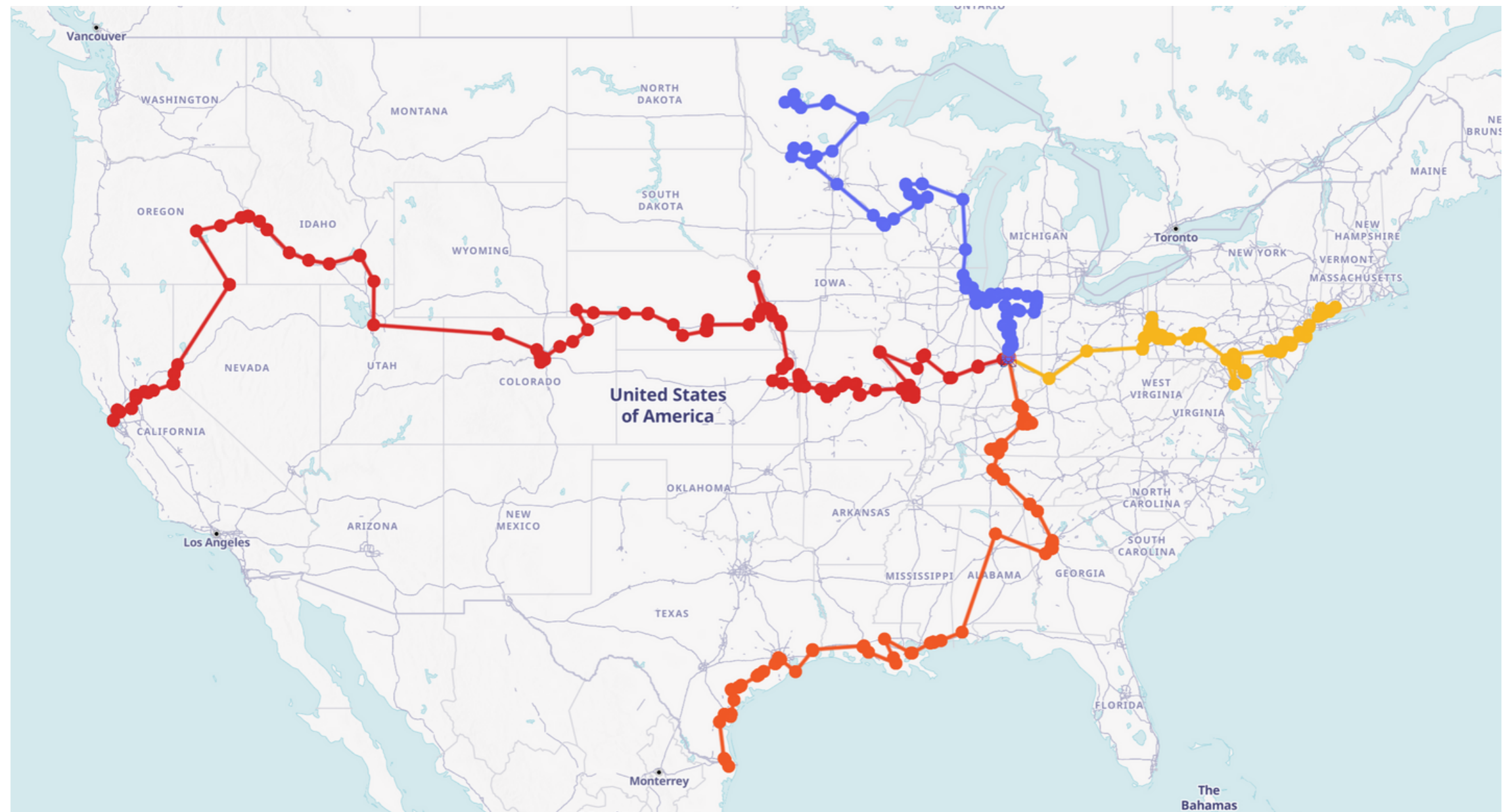

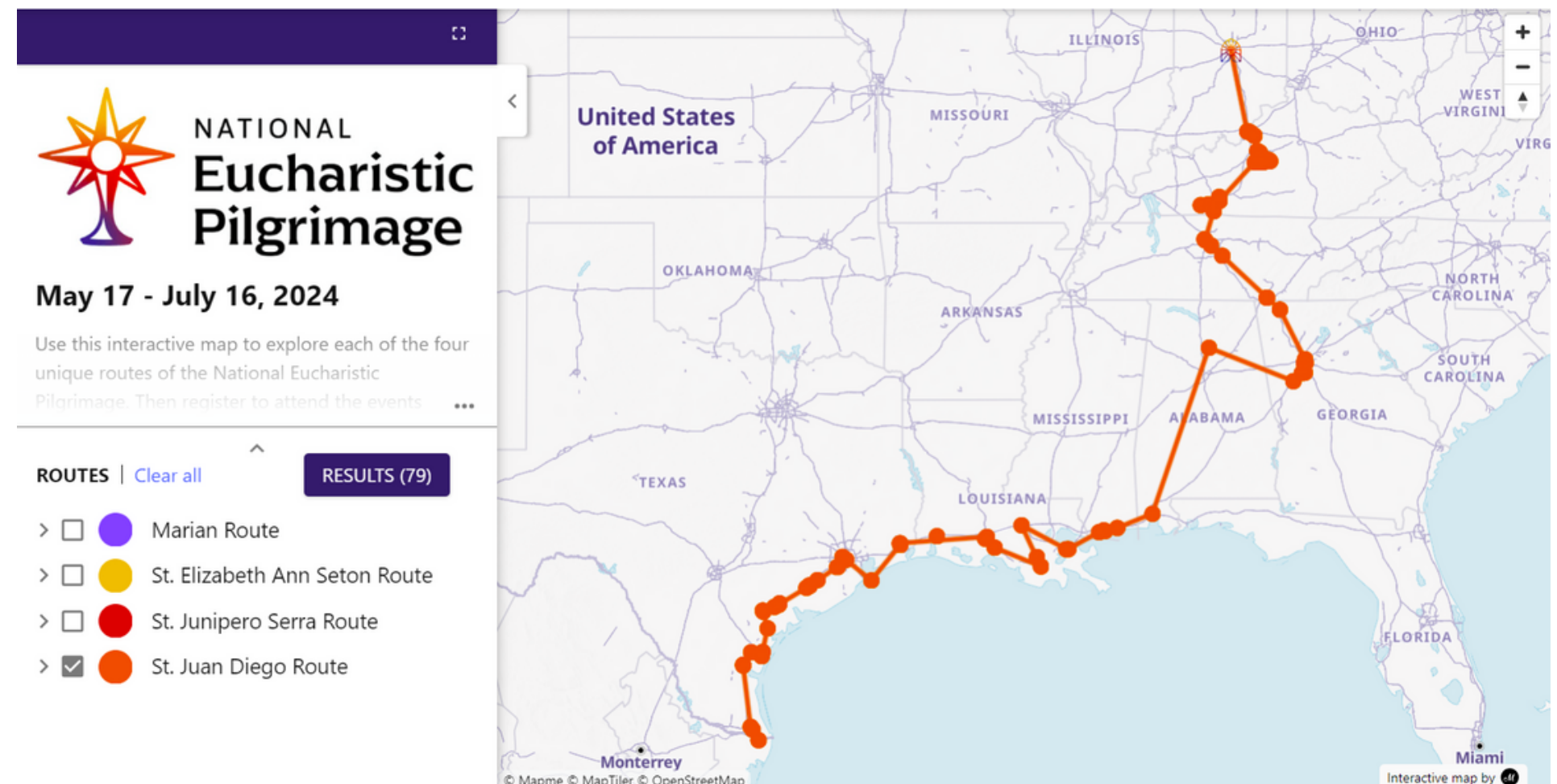

Notable Events along the Juan Diego Route

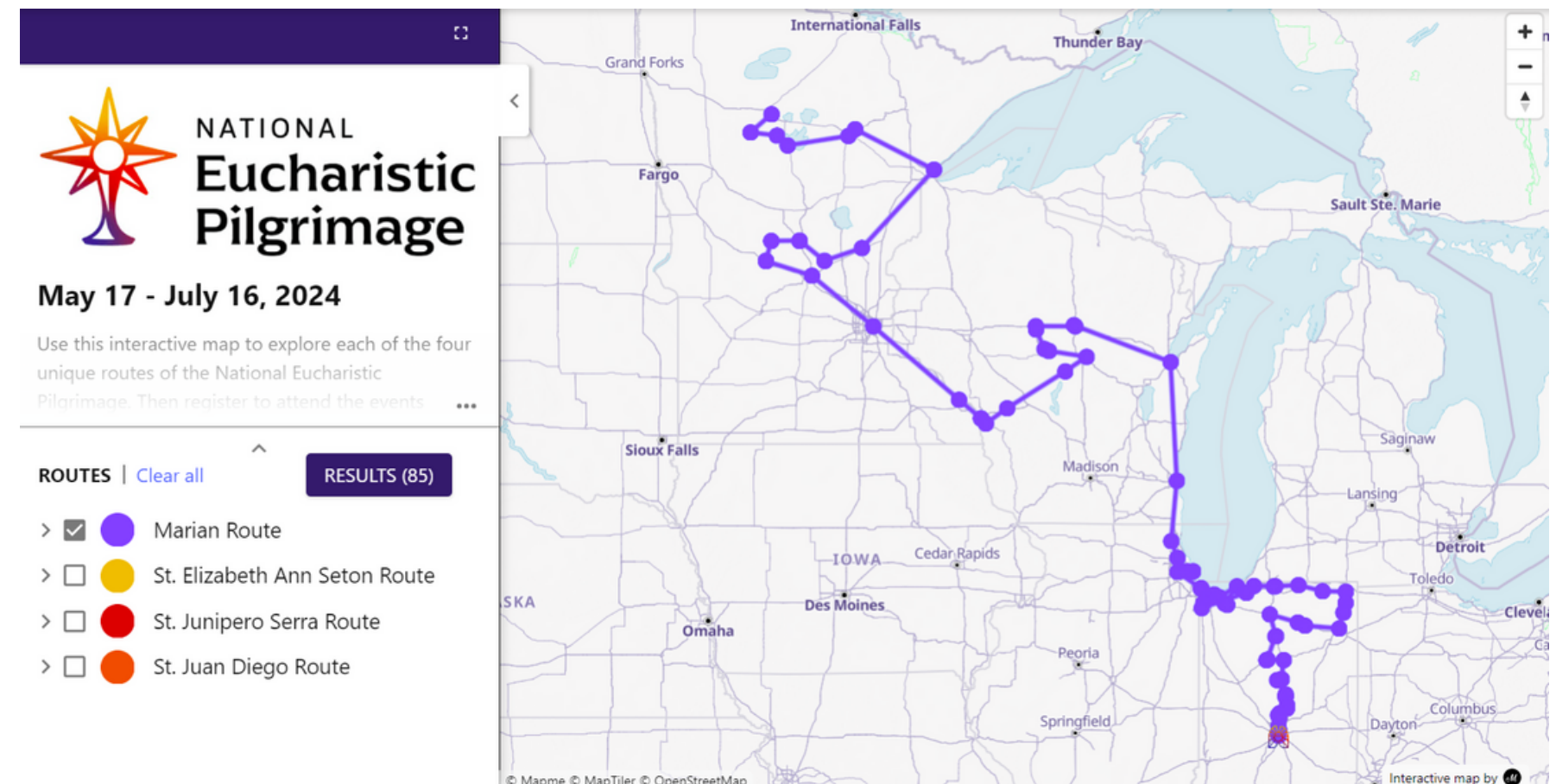
- Kickoff in the Diocese of Brownsville

Notable Events along the Marian Route

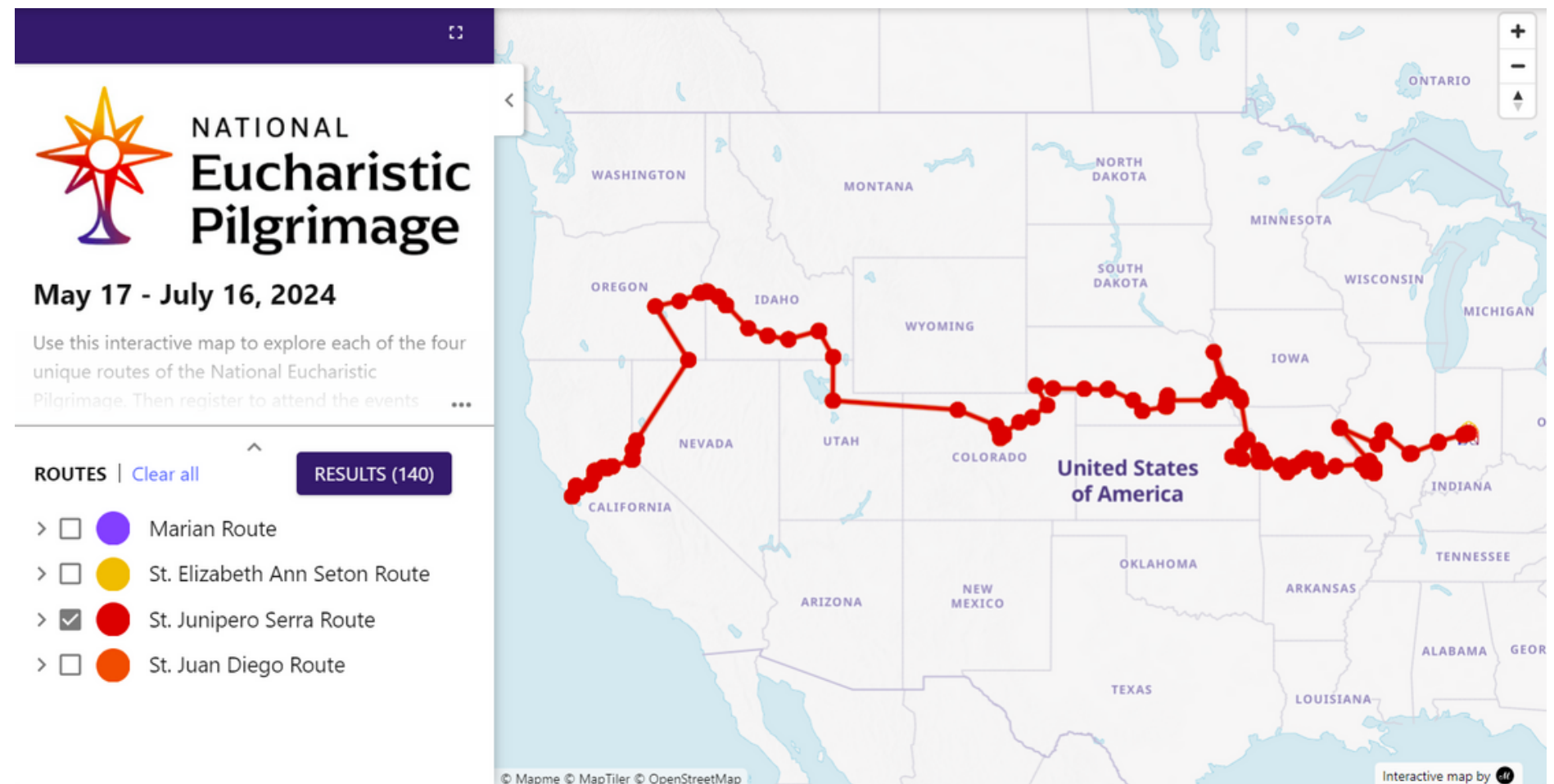
- Blessing of the Headwaters of the Mississippi River

Notable Events along the Serra Route

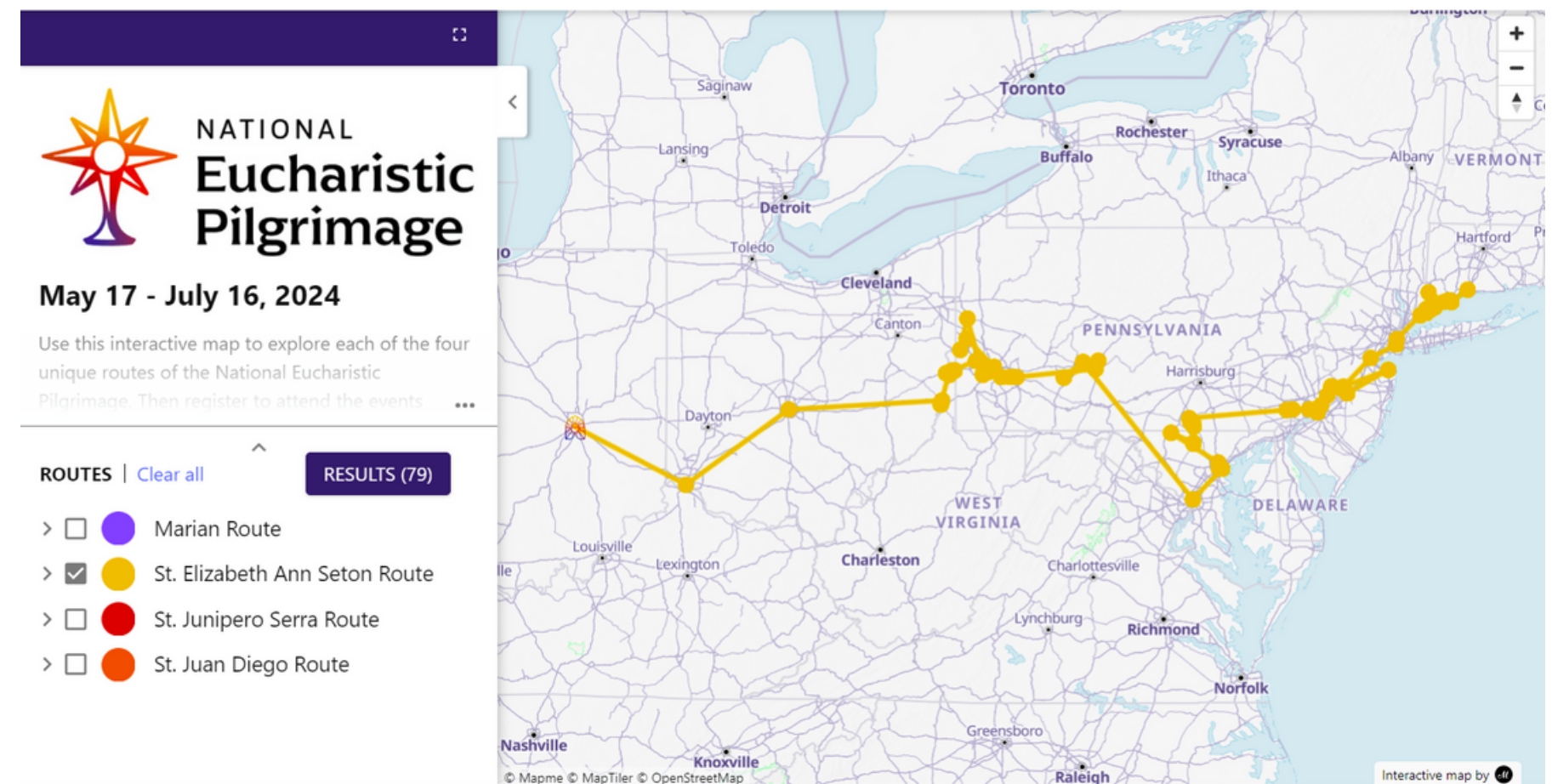
- Processing across the Golden Gate Bridge

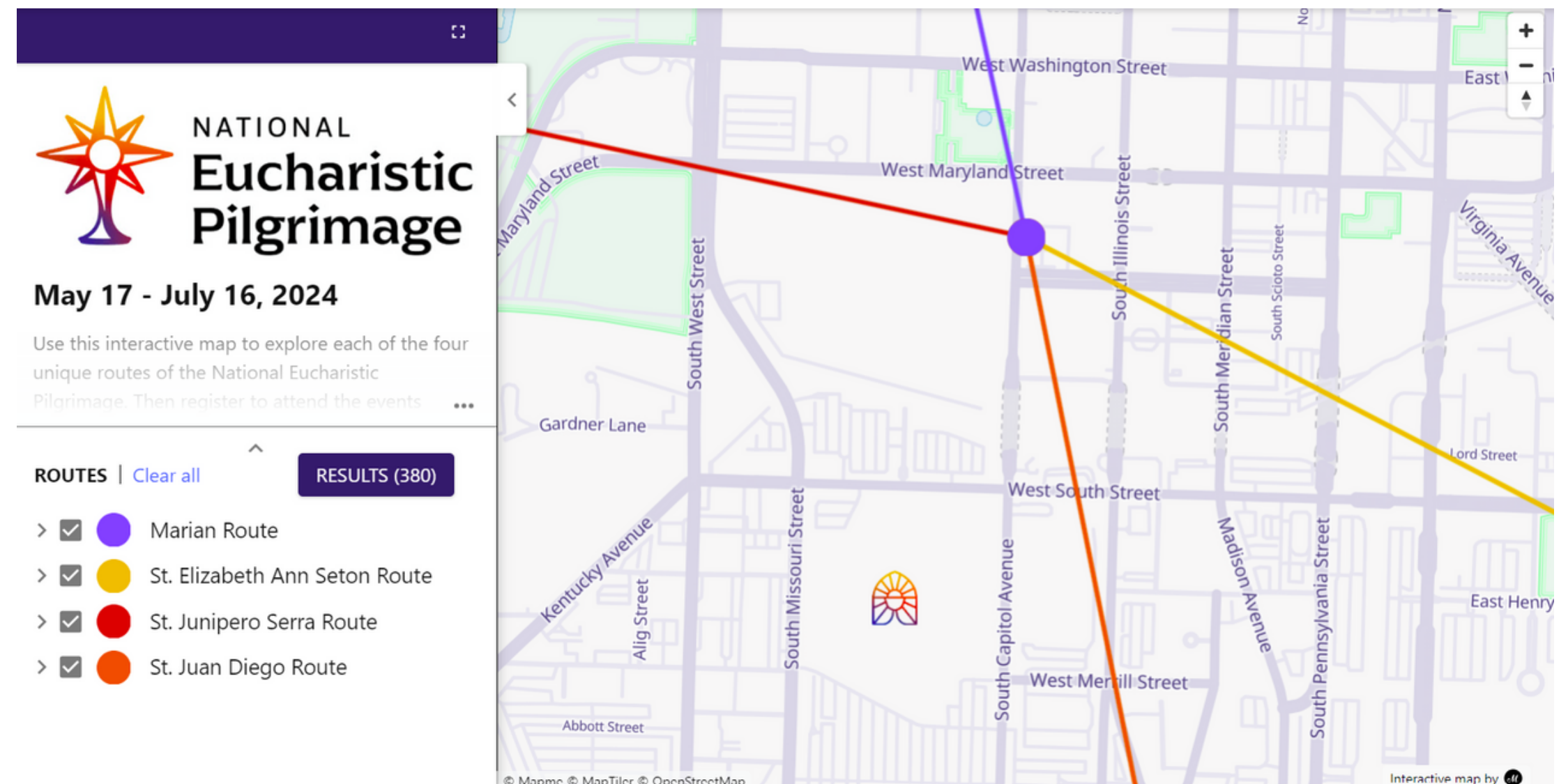

Mobile Adoration

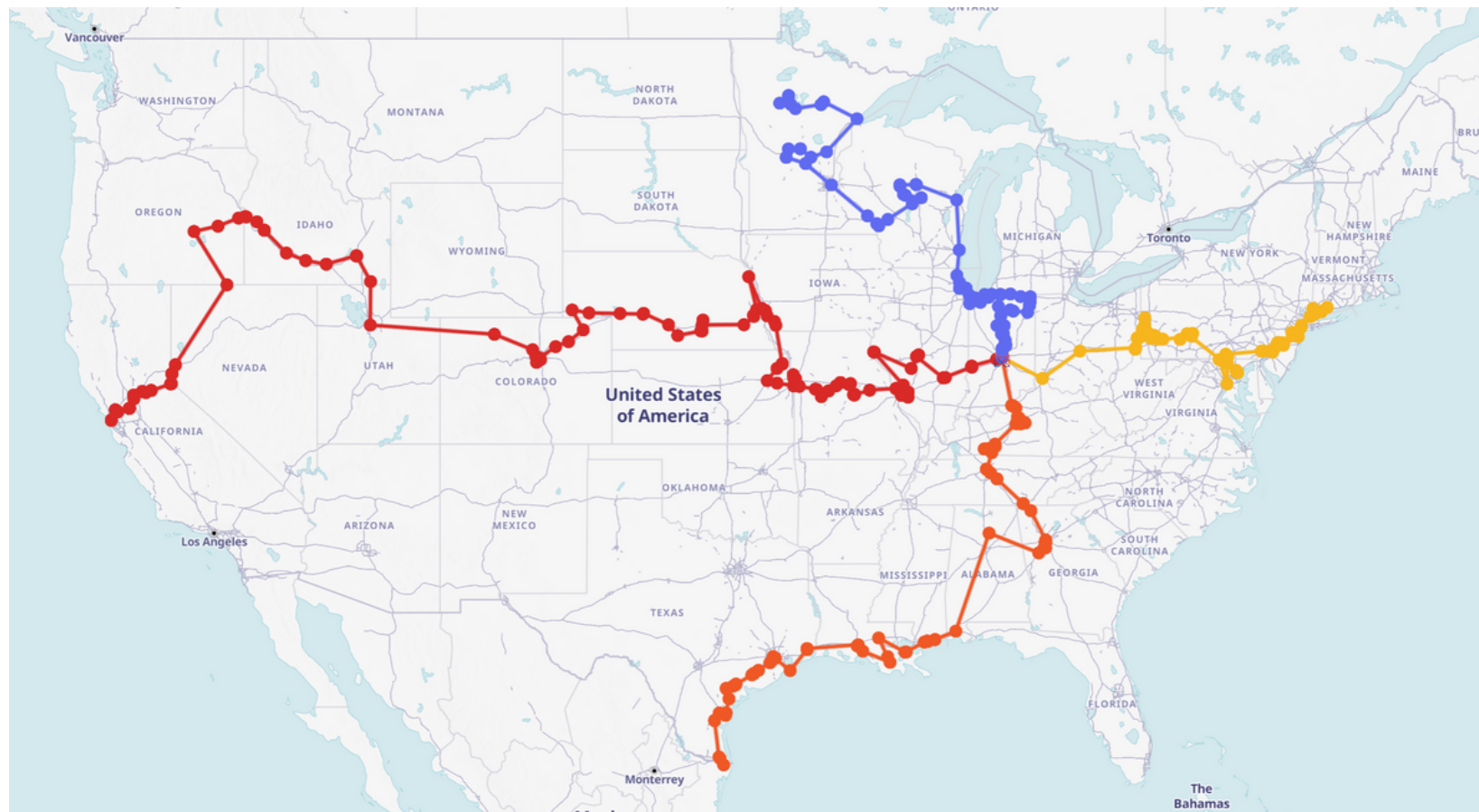
With the blessing of the National Eucharistic Congress, mobile adoration will occur on each route.
