



# **Directions to Braeside**

## **DIRECTIONS TO BRAESIDE FROM HWY#401**

- > Proceed on HWY#401 to Cambridge (if you are coming from Toronto, that is West; if you are coming from Sarnia, that is East).
- > At Cambridge, take the HWY#24 exit SOUTH
- > Continue on HWY#24. When you pass Highway #8 (Dundas Street) the road will turn into Water Street
- > The road splits shortly after HWY#8 so make sure you stay to the RIGHT to remain on Water Street
- > Proceed through the old part of Cambridge
- > You will go past Myers Road and Waynco Road
- > Watch for a small fork in the road and bear right onto East River Road - Glen Morris
- > Remain on East River Road and go through the village of Glen Morris. Just past Blue Lake Road (left hand side) you will go up a hill and Braeside Camp is at the top of the hill on the left hand side.

# **DIRECTIONS TO BRAESIDE FROM QEW**

- > From Toronto: Take the QEW WEST through Oakville and Burlington. Just past Guelph Line the road will split. Take HWY#403 HAMILTON (on your RIGHT)
- Stay on HWY #403 through Hamilton, Ancaster and Brantford. After you pass the HWY#24 exit in Brantford, take the NEXT exit, which will be Paris Road.
- Head toward Paris. There will be a Tim Horton's on the corner at the 2nd stoplight. Proceed through the lights about 1.5 km to the end of the road (Paris Road becomes Green Lane Road after the lights)
- > Turn right at the end of the road onto East River Road and proceed about 1.5 km to Braeside Camp. It will be on your right hand side.
