
Alumni Spotlight

Austin West, MS in Meteorology and Physical Oceanography '21, was recently awarded the prestigious Parsons Award for Scientific and Technical Progress by the Navy League of the United States. Every year, this award is given to a U.S. Navy or Marine Corps officer, enlisted or civilian, who has made an outstanding contribution in any field of science that has furthered the development and progress of the Navy or Marine Corps. This award is in recognition of West's research examining the atmospheric effects of the maritime environment on the Navy's High Energy Laser Weapons System (HELWS) and how adaptive optics could compensate for those effects making the futuristic weapons system more effective.






Retired Lt. Col. Brian Decker, MS

Professor John Arquilla, co-founder of Defense Analysis Dept. retires



After 30 years of extraordinary service at NPS, Distinguished Professor of Defense Analysis, John Arquilla has retired. An expert in special operations, unconventional warfare, and international policy, Arquilla has extensive experience advising senior military leaders and Department of Defense policymakers from Operation Desert Storm to Operation Enduring Freedom. Arquilla has published 14 books and authored many widely published articles and commentaries that have informed national policy.


In 1992, Arquilla co-founded the Defense Analysis Department at NPS with Dr. Gordon McCormick and then-CDR William McRaven. He designed and instituted the *Special Operations* and *Irregular Warfare* and *Information* Strategy and Political Warfare curricula. Since

that time, Arquilla has served as a professor of defense analysis and will continue to serve NPS as an emeritus professor.
