Athena will enable NPS students and faculty and, eventually, the broader DoD to discover existing, ongoing, and planned research. This ability will facilitate collaboration across our defense system and improve efficiency in solving the most challenging issues facing the Department of Defense. brings research demand and the research supply together."

as a Fulbright Scholar. Read more.








