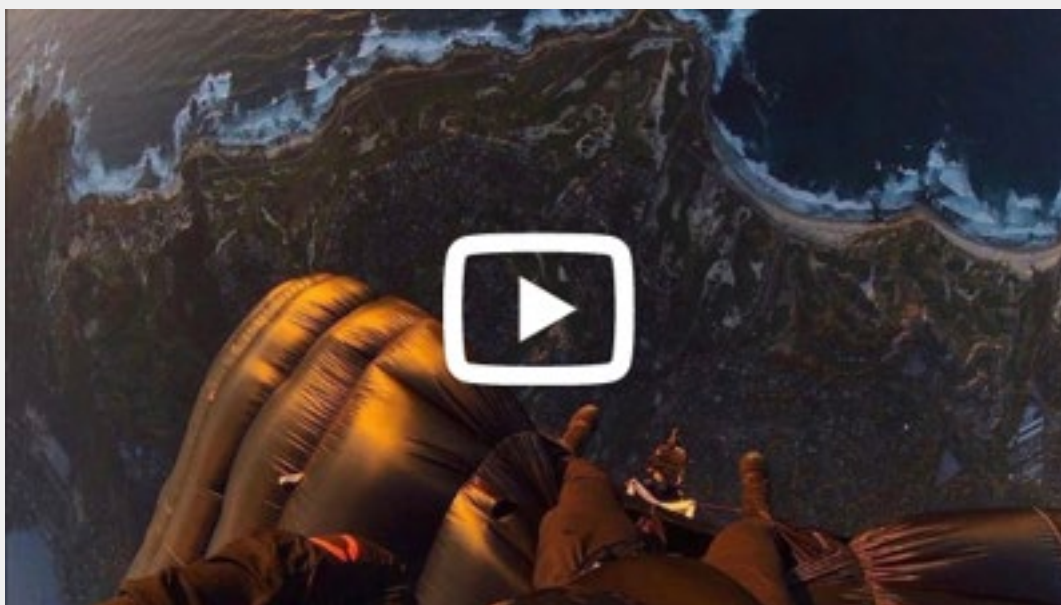




All Veteran Group Kicks Off America's Heroes Charity Golf Tournament

Former Commander of the Colombian Navy (CNO), retired [Admiral Guillermo Barrera](#), MS in Electrical and Electronics Engineering '83, recently returned to Monterey as a visiting subject matter expert from the U.S. Naval War College. While visiting NPS, Guillermo reflected on the impact his time here had on his own career.

"NPS gave me a technologically-broader picture of the world. This proved quite important, especially in recognizing new technology that will be needed in the near future. It's important to keep an open mind to this; defining the technology correctly in order to apply it to solve specific

problems," he added. "I learned this here at NPS and it allowed me to be more successful."

Guillermo also spoke to the importance of multinational collaboration at NPS. "These things affect my country, but they're not only in Colombia," Barrera said. "They start and end in other countries. This means that the solution is international and that we have to work together with all those affected. If I have a part of the problem, I also have a part of the solution," he continued. "Working together, we'll solve these problems."

Joint Interagency Field Experimentation 22-1



It's once again time for the Naval Postgraduate School's quarterly Joint Interagency Field Experimentation at Camp Roberts and The Sea Land Air Military Research Initiative Lab. JIFX 22-1 is taking place now, Nov. 1-5, and experimenters now have access to 5G capabilities thanks to a Collaborative Research and Development Agreement (CRADA) with AT&T.

The JIFX program exists to provide an opportunity for NPS faculty, students, private companies, and academia to demonstrate and evaluate new technologies related to US Navy and United States Department of Defense research in an operational field environment, and also to provide the operational community the opportunity to experiment with these technologies to better understand the capabilities that they may represent.

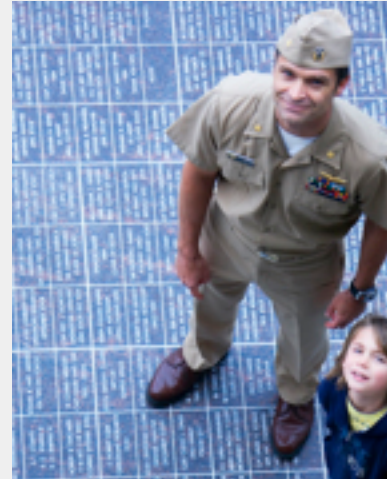
