NPS Foundation Gifts Game-Changing Collaboration Tool, Athena, to NPS in Transfer Ceremony

The Naval Postgraduate School Foundation held a ceremony Sept. 6 symbolizing the transfer of Athena, an innovative collaborative research tool, to the Naval Postgraduate School.

For over a year, the NPS Foundation has been working with a team of developers to build a scalable platform that can empower the national security innovation ecosystem. The NPS Foundation invested over \$550,000 and contributed thousands of volunteer hours on the design and development of Athena.

Athena addresses one the Department of Defense and academia's greatest challenges: disconnectedness. Athena will enable students, faculty, researchers and sponsors at NPS and across the DOD to access and query information currently stored in numerous separate databases by use of keywords, topics of interest, service priorities and other filters. Leaders at every level can see who is doing the work in their area of interest, connect with the right people, and create collaboration across boundaries of organization and academic discipline.

"Athena increases the impact of the Naval Postgraduate School on the U.S. Navy and Department of Defense by creating a living hub for research at NPS and beyond, making it accessible to the entire community of students and faculty, as well as potential partners, sponsors and collaborators across the DOD," said Karen Hargrove, NPS Foundation Trustee and project lead for Athena's development. "The national security challenges we face require close collaboration across the Joint Force for us to spur innovation and achieve a competitive advantage."

"I chose to write about naval aviator identity and culture because I wanted a topic that combined my future as a pilot and my interests: airplanes and psychology. One of the most interesting finds in my research was how long the Navy, and the military in general, have developed uncrewed aircraft technology. Crewed and uncrewed aircraft developed simultaneously from the early 1900s through the present, yet we, as an organization, often fail to talk about the uncrewed history and development in favor of the potentially more glamorous and consistently developed area of crewed flight." U.S. Pacific Fleet Hosts Commander's Conference at NPS

NPS alumni leading from the front! Adm. Samuel Paparo, MS Systems Analysis '15, Commander, U.S. Pacific Fleet (PACFLT) and NPS alumnus, recently held his PACFLT Commander's Conference at the Naval Postgraduate School, Aug. 8-9.

"NPS is the premier DOD school of technology for warfighting. It's also close to the center of U.S. innovation and the preponderance of forces assigned to the

U.S. Pacific Fleet," explained Paparo. "We continue to deepen ties between NPS and the Fleet to identify relevant challenges and find solutions to build out our capabilities today while also simultaneously guiding generations of warfighters in the future."

The conference brought together senior-level commanders from across the Navy and Marine Corps to assess the current operational environment and discuss priorities and challenges, with a focus on the Indo-

The Navy established the Artificial Intelligence Task Forces so that warfare communities can develop knowledge, skills, data models, applications, and algorithms that will provide our forces 21st-century decision superiority and combat advantage.

On August 22-26, the Naval Postgraduate School hosted the latest Naval Artificial Intelligence Summit. This is the third quarterly meeting of the group at NPS, which

brings together representatives from seven Naval AI task forces, Surface Warfare – Task Force Hopper, Navy Special Warfare – Task Force Proteus, Undersea Warfare – Task Force Turing, Naval Aviation – Task Force Ellyson, Explosive Ordinance Disposal – Task Force Titan, Information Warfare – Task Force Station HYPO, Unmanned systems (for CENTCOM) – Task Force 59, to provide updates on their activities, challenges, and successes and to strategize applications of artificial intelligence to Naval warfare and military operations. With heavy hearts we announce the passing of former NPS Foundation Trustee and distinguished NPS alumnus, Rear Adm. James "Jim" B. Greene, Jr., U.S. Navy (Ret.). Greene served the U.S. Navy with honor and dedication for more than 50 years—31 years on active duty and two decades of service as a faculty member at the Naval Postgraduate School.

Rear Adm. Greene and his wife Susan are longtime supporters of the Naval Postgraduate School and were founding members of the Naval Postgraduate School Foundation. Later, Greene served on the NPS Foundation Board of Trustees for 10 years and subsequently as a Trustee Emeritus.

During his time as a Foundation Trustee, Jim wrote, "We believe strongly in the mission of NPS to properly educate the future military and civilian leaders of our nation in an academic setting that strongly promotes interaction among all our armed forces. In addition, the presence on campus of international students from over 60 allied nations presents an extraordinary opportunity for coalition building at a grassroots level that will serve our nation well as these students advance through the ranks and assume leadership roles in their respective nations. This makes NPS unique as a national institution. We are pleased to be able to help NPSF



enhance the student educational experience through financial and equipment support."

Greene joined the faculty at NPS in 2002 as a Professor of the Practice and NPS' Chair of Acquisition, launching the school's Acquisition Research Program. Greene earned an MS in Electrical Engineering in 1972 and an MS in Management in 1973 from NPS and was presented the Distinguished Alumni Award in May of 2006. Read more from NPS.

U.S. Navy Vice Adm. Frank M. Bradley, MS in Physics '06, assumed command of Joint Special Operations Command, Fort Bragg, North Carolina in August 2022. Bradley previously served as Commander, U.S. Special Operations Command Central, MacDill Air Force Base, Florida. Bradley has commanded at all levels of special operations, including as the commander of Naval Special Warfare Development Group. He has multiple tours in command of joint task forces and was among the first to deploy into Afghanistan following the attacks of September 11, 2001. Additionally, he has served with SEAL Team FOUR, SEAL Delivery Vehicle Team TWO and the Italian Incursori (Italian SEALs) as an international exchange officer.

Bradley is a 1991 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy. He began his career as a SEAL after completing Basic Underwater Demolition school (BUDs/SEAL) Class 179 in 1992. Bradley earned a Masters in Physics from the Naval Postgraduate School where he received a provisional patent for his research in 2006.

U.S. Navy Rear Adm. **Keith B. Davids,** MS in Manpower Systems Analysis '98, assumed command of **Naval Special Warfare** during a change of command ceremony at Naval Amphibious Base, Coronado, on Aug. 19.

Davids most recently served as commander, Special Operations Command South, Homestead Air Reserve Base, Florida. His operational tours include platoon commander tours at SEAL Team Two; element leader and squadron operations officer tours at Naval Special Warfare Development Group; executive officer of SEAL Team Seven; commanding officer of SEAL Team One, and commander of Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force, Iraq. He has made numerous operational deployments to Iraq, Afghanistan, the Pacific, and Europe. Davids is a 1990 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy.




