Record-Breaking 2022 Campaign for the Arts

On June 16, nearly 300 Allied Arts donors, art administrators, artists, volunteers and friends came together to mark the end of the 2022 campaign. At the Celebration Event held at **Oklahoma Contemporary**, campaign chairs **Sody and Robert Clements** announced that the organization had raised a historic \$4,823,790 for central Oklahoma's cultural community through the 2022 campaign and American Rescue Plan Act funds.

"What a milestone to raise a historic \$4.8 million for Allied Arts and our local cultural landscape, the most in any Allied Arts fundraising campaign," said **Robert Clements**, 2022 Campaign Chair. "The overwhelming generosity from all sectors of our community speaks volumes about the value of the arts to our region's quality of life. The Allied Arts network of 40+ cultural nonprofits is relying on this support more than ever as they continue to feel the effects of the pandemic."

The Clements thanked each and every donor who contributed and made it possible for Allied Arts to exceed the budgeted goal of \$3.4 million. Visionary Donors that contributed \$100,000 or more include: The Chickasaw Nation; City of Oklahoma City; Devon Energy Corporation; Hobby Lobby; Kirkpatrick Family Fund; and OGE Energy Corp.

In partnership with the **City of Oklahoma City**, Allied Arts will award \$1 million in COVID-relief grants to eligible arts nonprofits

based in Oklahoma City that demonstrate need and pandemicrelated losses or expenses.

"Mayor David Holt and the City of Oklahoma City leadership recognize that the nonprofit arts industry is an important sector of our economy, and financial support is necessary to mitigate the impact of COVID-19 on the organizations that work tirelessly to transform lives through the arts," said **Deborah McAuliffe Senner**, Allied Arts president and CEO.

As part of the 2022 campaign, employee giving presentations were delivered at 146 local businesses and nonprofit organizations, generating 20% of the total raised. The top employee giving sites were: the Heart of the City; American Fidelity; Continental Resources; OGE Energy Corp.; Devon Energy Corporation; Newmark Robinson Park and Robinson Park; Bank of Oklahoma; BancFirst; Crowe & Dunlevy; and Duncan Oil.

Allied Arts to Award More Than \$3.7 Million in Grants

As part of the annual allocations process, two sets of volunteer committees convened in May to review Allied Arts member agency financial and narrative application materials. The allocations finance committee convened over the course of a week to review agency budgets, 990s, audits and other financial documentation.

A few weeks later, the allocations committee listened to presentations delivered by member agency staff and board leadership over a three-day period. This committee's focus was on community impact and caliber of program delivery. This year's presentations indicate that Allied Arts member agencies are coming out stronger from the pandemic with a renewed sense of purpose. Another theme that ran throughout the presentations was collaboration. Many of the Allied Arts member agencies, grantees and other local arts nonprofits are partnering in exciting ways to broaden their reach and impact.

Although the outlook is brighter than two years ago, the nonprofit cultural community continues to feel the negative effects of the pandemic. Allied Arts will continue its efforts to raise vital funding to help Restart the Arts as our arts groups work tirelessly to bring their vital programs and services back to pre-pandemic levels.

Allocations are directed to the 25 Allied Arts member agencies. As unrestricted funds, allocation grants can be used where they are most needed - covering operating budget line items, payment of teaching artists and offsetting costs associated with free outreach programs that do not generate revenue but are vital to our community's quality of life.

Through the educational outreach grants, Allied Arts provides critical dollars to initiatives that introduce or strengthen arts programming to Oklahoma school-aged children in schools, libraries, community centers, art facilities and remotely as well as supporting outreach programming for veterans, hospitalized adults, developmentally disabled adults and the elderly.

The capacity-building program lends support to organizational infrastructure strengthening efforts. Funded projects include professional development for staff, strategic planning sessions resulting in concrete action plans, technology upgrades to enhance efficiency, and audits of development and marketing strategies to increase fundraising and brand awareness.

Allied Arts commissions public art in Oklahoma City to mark 50th anniversary



To commemorate Allied Arts' 50th anniversary, we have commissioned local artist **Joe Slack** to create a 25-foot piece of public art to be placed in front of the new Oklahoma City Convention Center. **W&W AFCO Steel** and **Rick Cooper** are underwriters of the larger-than-life steel sculpture, which is also dedicated to Cooper's father, Bert.



"I like that with steel you can work on a monumental scale," says Slack. "I like seeing people walk up to a piece and look up." Entitled "Together Together," Slack's piece is about personal connections and community dialogue. The scale of the piece facilitates people coming together as Slack designed the foundational blocks to be functional. Visitors and passersby will be able to sit on the blocks, while the lines and voids represent the road map of life.

After revealing images of the sculpture, Allied Arts received great interest from board members, donors and other constituents in the opportunity to purchase smaller versions of the piece. Allied Arts is thrilled to share that Slack is creating a limited number – only 50 – of 25-inch replicas of "Together Together" for \$3,000 per piece. Each piece is hand made by the artist.

ABOUT THE ARTIST: Joe Slack is inspired by primitive art and mid-century modern design. He works with simplified forms and repetitive patterns influenced by human observation and the effects of positive and negative space. Slack encourages viewers to find their own meaning when it comes to his art.

"I want people to walk away with their own perspective on the work," explains Slack. "Once you create it and put it out there, you can't control what people think. I want them to see their version of my piece. And I hope people walk away a little happier than before they saw it."

Slack attended art school at Oklahoma City University and began his sculpting career working with wood, a material he had been drawn to since he was a kid building skateboard ramps in his backyard. Once he discovered the magnitude and the permanence of steel, he shifted his vision.
