# 2023 Campaign for the Arts

Allied Arts is thrilled to announce that **Hillary and Peter Farrell** will serve as co-chairs for the 2023 fundraising campaign. The husband-wife team will spearhead Allied Arts campaign efforts, including serving as the faces of the campaign, leading a team of volunteers and generating new support to meet the \$3.6 million budgeted goal.

The Farrells are long-time Allied Arts donors and local art enthusiasts, with Hillary currently serving on the Allied Arts executive committee of the board of directors and chairing the marketing committee. Principal of strategic marketing firm Farrell Consulting, Hillary is a board and executive committee member of United Way of Central Oklahoma and Arts Council Oklahoma City. She also previously served on the board and executive committee of Oklahoma Visual Arts Coalition. An alumni of the Art

Institute of Boston (now The College of Art & Design at Lesley University), Peter is an executive with a career built on developing integrated strategic plans and creative solutions for brands such as Chesapeake Energy, The Chickasaw Nation, Delta Faucets, Gillette, HP, Hunter Douglas, INTEGRIS Health, Keurig, Monster. com, NEC, OG&E, Reebok and WPX Energy. Together, Hillary and Peter have held volunteer roles with several Allied Arts member agencies and non-arts nonprofits. Their daughter Rowan is a second grader who enjoys spending her summers at Camp Contemporary.

Joining the Farrells on the campaign are **Sherri and Bill Lance**, who will serve as honorary chairs. The Lances are also steadfast Allied Arts supporters, having co-chaired the 2018 OPUS fundraising gala which raised a record \$550,000. Sherri is president and managing partner of **Gaming Capital Group**, and Bill is Secretary of State for the **Chickasaw Nation**. Together, they chaired the 2019 United Way of Central Oklahoma campaign, raising \$17.5 million for critical social service agencies – many partnering with Allied Arts member agencies to transform lives through the arts.

An Allied Arts campaign donation at any giving level ensures that art can help meet the diverse needs in our community. For example, a gift of \$25 provides supplies

for a student receiving financial assistance to participate in visual art afterschool programming; a contribution of \$50 offsets the cost of offering a dance and movement class for people suffering with Parkinson's disease; and a \$250 donation purchases a guitar for a veteran learning to use music as a tool for healing and finding purpose again.

# 2023 Step-Up Artist - Meet Lauren Florence

As part of our annual initiative to feature local artists. Lauren Florence will serve as the Allied Arts 2023 Step-Up Artist. Donors who contribute \$150 or more through their company's employee giving campaign in support of Allied Arts can opt to receive one of two 12"x12" framed and signed prints, hand embellished by the artist.

A figurative painter, Florence explores the intricate relationships between people and animals in her pieces. Often working from vintage photographs, she combines elements, layers and vibrant color to create a narrative in each piece, working toward moments of awe or wonder.

"I want to create work that is immediately joyful, with narratives that give the viewer pause, pique their interest, and transport them in a positive way," said Florence.

Florence grew up in Bartlesville and was influenced at an early age by the wonderful art collection, both Native and non-Native, at Woolaroc Museum and Wildlife Refuge just a few miles away. The wildlife and people of that area still play a substantial role in her work today.
