THE BOARD OF NESS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS January 2, 2024

The Ness County Board of Commissioners met in regular session Monday, January 2, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. in the Ness County Commissioner Chambers. Chairman Travis Petersilie called the meeting to order with Commissioners Mark Davis, Dave Albers, and County Clerk Lori Hertel in attendance.

Road and Bridge

Ness County Road and Bridge/Landfill Supervisor Ron Johnson made a correction to tipping fees of \$95.00 from December 12th thru December 16th, and \$275.00 for December 19th – 23rd. A crossing permit was approved for American Warrior, Inc. to install a pipeline for transport of saltwater. Permits are on file at the Road and Bridge Department. Fuel bids were presented as: Nusser- \$19,870.00, Midland Marketing-\$19,996.10, and AV Energy, LLC-\$20,242.50.

<u>Motion:</u> Upon the motion of Albers, seconded by Petersilie, Commission voted unanimously to accept low bid from Nusser Fuels for \$19,870.00. All bids are available for view at the Ness County Clerk's Office.

Commission and Johnson discussed Landfill reinspection results. All violations have been corrected. Post Closure Report for Landfill was reviewed and discussed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners shall cause the financial statements and financial reports of Ness County to be prepared on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements as adjusted to show compliance with the cash basis and budget laws of this State.

Resolution 2024 – 02

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF NESS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN RURAL OPPORTUNITY ZONE STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM CALENDAR YEAR 2024

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF $\underline{\text{NESS}}$ COUNTY, KANSAS,

Section 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 74-50,223, the Board of County Commissioners expressed its intent to participate in the Rural Opportunity Zone (ROZ) student loan repayment program.

Section 2. NESS County has been designated a Rural Opportunity Zone pursuant to K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 74-50,222. As of July 1, 2023, the County population was <u>2645</u> as certified by the Kansas Department of Revenue.

Section 3. NESS County Commissioners hereby obligate NESS County to participate in the ROZ student loan repayment program as provided by K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 74-50,223 for a period of five years, which shall be irrevocable.

Section 4. <u>NESS</u> County agrees to pay in equal shares with the State of Kansas the outstanding student loan balance of any resident individual for five years if the resident individual meets the terms of qualification provided by the State of Kansas in K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 74-50,223, and the appropriate rules and regulations. The number of qualified resident individuals receiving such payments will be subject to the availability of funds.

Section 5. <u>NESS</u> County intends to enter into partnerships with Cities, Employers, and Foundations for the direct sponsorship of Rural Opportunity Zone Applicants. Sponsored Applicants must meet all qualifications of the ROZ program. All sponsorships will be subject to ROZ student loan repayment rules and regulations.

Section 6. The maximum student loan balance for each qualified resident individual to be repaid jointly by <u>NESS</u> County and the State of Kansas shall be \$15,000 over a term of five years.

Section 7. NESS County shall allocate \$0.00 a year for the purpose of matching payments from the State of Kansas to qualified resident individuals. NESS County shall revise its ROZ budget on an annual basis submitting a new Resolution to the State of Kansas by January 30th each year. NESS County shall submit their obligation in full to the Department of Commerce before the first day of October each year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be published once in the official county newspaper and shall be in effect from and after its date of publication.
