A Day at Lake Manyara National Park: After breakfast, we depart at 8:00 am driving to lake Manyara. Manyara National Park is located below and along the escarpment of the Great Rift Valley. Manyara National Park attained its status in 1960 covering an area of 325 sqkm of which, one third of the park is occupied by the lake. Manyara National Park is known for huge groups of baboons. Thousands of water birds may be seen in Lake Manyara, like Flamingos, Pelicans, and storks. Lush forests and hot springs which are unique in Africa. Tree climbing lions, elephants, zebras, and wildebeests plus more than 400 varieties of bird species. Manyara National Park has four different types of habitats, which makes it the most lovable and visited small park by lots of foreigners and locals alike. We will end our day at Manyara National Park with a late afternoon drive for dinner, and overnight rest at the hotel.

TAT Tip: Interested in a cultural experience? Right near this area is Lake Eyasi home of the Hadzabe Tribe, one of the oldest hunter gatherer societies in the world. Take a day learning primitive survival techniques as well as what life from another time is like with the tribe.
