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New Device Info

Media (Pictures & Videos):

- When to take media: At the initial fitting appointment, when there are questions or concerns, or before adjustment requests.
- How to take media: Hold camera at same elevation as patient's affected limb and take pictures of front, back and side of affected limb. Hold camera stationary & horizontally (landscape) and take videos of patient walking back and forth past the camera.
- How to share media: Upload all of your media with patient name in subject line at OrthoPets.Filemail.com

Initial Fit of Device:

- Watch the fitting video for your device! Visit orthopets.com/fitting-videos
- Trim excess straps hanging off device to prevent catching and irritation.
- Trim width of pads so they do not overlap the shell for best fit.

Break-In Schedule & Adjustments:

- Like a new pair of shoes orthotic and prosthetic devices require a break in period, to reduce the chance of skin irritation or sores. Daily inspection of the limb is highly recommended.
- The typical break-in period is 14 days. Please note some unique cases will require a different wear schedule.
- The goal is to use the device full time (8-10 hours per day) once your patient has adjusted to wearing the orthotic/prosthetic device:
 - Week 1: 3 4 wearing sessions per day with each session duration of 1-2 hours.
 - Week 2: 5 6 wearing sessions per day with each session duration of 1-2 hours.
 - o After week 2, extend both the frequency and duration of sessions as your patient permits.
- If you notice hair loss, swelling, irritation, or sores please contact your veterinarian and your OrthoPets Specialist. Discontinue use of the device until further notice.
- To ensure the best patient-device co-adaptation, adjustments to the device may be necessary.

Rehabilitation:

• Evidence suggests that patient outcomes are enhanced with rehabilitation therapy. Seek this care with your veterinarian or ask your veterinarian for a referral.

Refurbishments:

- Device refurbishment is recommended every 12 to 24-months, depending on how active the patient is.
