

The Art Students League of New York is delighted to offer the following Grants and Scholarships through the annual Merit Competition. Unless otherwise stated, Grants include tuition for one full-time class for the Regular Session (September-May) plus a cash award and are open only to League members. Scholarships are open to all current and prospective new students and provide tuition for one full-time class for a Regular Session. Partial tuition scholarships are also awarded. Participation in the Competition is based on eligibility criteria listed below. Available awards are subject to change.

Please read the following information carefully prior to beginning your application.

# **APPLICATION PROCEDURE/SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

- Create a free online account on Submittable.
- Required fields are marked with a red asterisk (\*).
- An Art Students League ID number is required.
- New students applying for a scholarship must create a League account to obtain a Student Identification Number by clicking <a href="here">here</a>.
- Complete and sign the application form (Note: applicants to the McDowell Travel Grant will be asked to submit a notarized affidavit).
- Upload three (3) digital images of original artwork created within the past year.
- Artworks in multiple panels (diptych, triptych) must be submitted as a single image file.
- Individual works of sculpture may be photographed from multiple angles but must be submitted as a single image file.
- Save each file in JPEG format, no larger than 2 MB (megabytes).
- Optional information: The Art Students League is able to designate certain scholarships based on donor intent. Providing demographic information is voluntary, but can help the Art Students League distribute awards more effectively. This information has no bearing on the competition itself, which is judged solely on the basis of submitted artwork.

# **MERIT SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY**

- Open to students working in all genres of drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture, and mixed media.
- Students must apply to <u>ONE</u> of three categories: <u>Realism</u>, <u>Abstract</u>, or <u>Semi-Abstract/Semi-Objective</u>.
- League Membership is not required.
- There are no minimum registration hours required.
- Prior Merit Scholarship recipients are not eligible.
- New students applying for a scholarship must create a League account to obtain an Art Students League ID Number by clicking here.
- Recipients of a tuition scholarship must enroll in classes for the 2024/25 Regular Session and fully use the scholarship by May 31, 2025. Scholarships may not be deferred.
- International students must have a visa status permitting full-time study at time of application and for the 2024/25 Regular Session.
- Temporary international visitors to the United States are not eligible.

#### **GRANTS ELIGIBILITY**

- League membership in good standing at time of application (member status may not be Lapsed or Dropped). For further information regarding membership and membership status, please click here.
- Candidates must be enrolled in class(es) at the time of application and competition.
- Eligibility for grants is keyed to registration hours AND areas of concentration. For example, students who have been registered full-time in only a sculpture class will not be eligible for painting grants. Please see Available Awards below for complete details.
- At the time of application candidates must have completed a minimum of 1,120 cumulative class hours (full-time and/or part-time, excluding workshops), of which 420 class hours must be in the current Regular Session (September 2023 May 2024) (see "Grants Eligibility & Class Hours" below)
- Past recipients of an individual grant may not reapply for the same grant (exception: Nessa Cohen Grant) but may apply for other grants (based on eligibility).
- International students must have the appropriate visa status allowing full-time study at the time of application and for the 2024/25 Regular Session.
- Temporary international visitors to the United States, regardless of membership status, are not eligible for the grant competition.

**COMPETITION AWARD LIMIT POLICY** Students may apply to only one Merit Scholarship category (Realism; Abstract; Semi-Abstract/Semi-Figurative). Eligible students may apply for any number of grants but may receive only <u>one</u> award during the entire competition. Students who apply for more than one grant, and subsequently win an award, will be withdrawn from all other awards of lesser value. Students winning a scholarship and then a grant automatically cede the award of lesser value.

**GRANTS ELIGIBITY and CLASS HOURS** Competition eligibility is based on registration hours in regular and online classes (excluding workshops and uninstructed sketch classes), regardless of full-time or part-time registration status. Following are <u>approximate</u> equivalents for class hours and monthly registration:

1,120 hours = approximately 16 months of full-time classes or more than 32 months of part-time classes

420 hours = approximately 6 months of <u>full-time classes</u> or the equivalent in <u>multiple part-time classes</u> (Note: For grant eligibility, it is not possible in a Regular Session to meet this quota prior to the application deadline through registration in a single part-time class.)

GRANTS ELIGIBILITY and MEMBERSHIP STATUS (does not apply to Scholarship eligibility) Applicants for grants must be members of the Art Students League of New York in good standing at the time of the competition. Students are strongly advised to verify membership status *before* applying. Members whose status is *Dropped* or *Lapsed* are not eligible. Members whose status is "Lapsed" may simply renew by paying dues for the current year. Members whose status is "Dropped" must submit a written/signed "Request for Reinstatement" for consideration by the Board of Control, which meets monthly from September to June. The Annual Registration Fee (paid every 12 months by all registered students) is not equivalent to paying annual Membership dues and does not constitute ASL membership.

# **AVAILABLE AWARDS\***

#### Xavier Gonzalez and Ethel Edwards Travel Grant

Two awards of \$15,000 and full-time tuition for one class during the regular school year *In addition to the requirements listed above, the following details are specific to this grant:* 

- Travel and study in Spain for at least four (4) months
- Open to students whose focus is painting in any medium or style

# Edward G. McDowell Travel Grant

One award of \$10,000 and full-time tuition for one class during the regular school year *In addition to the requirements listed above, the following details are specific to this grant:* 

- Travel/study in Europe for at least two (2) months, to include Paris
- Open to single (unmarried) students working in any medium or style

# The following Terms & Conditions are required only for applicants for the Gonzalez/Edwards and/or McDowell grants:

- Recipients of the Xavier Gonzalez and Ethel Edwards Travel Grant must agree to travel to Spain
  and remain there for study in the field of painting for four (4) months, to begin using the grant
  prior to August 30, 2024. Recipients must also agree to send progress reports to the Board of
  Control.
  - Recipients agree to submit a travel itinerary with budget, and a personal statement detailing what they plan to accomplish with the travel grant.
- The recipient of an **Edward G. McDowell Travel Grant** must agree to travel to Europe and remain there for study for at least two (2) months, to begin using the grant by August 30, 2024. The recipient must also agree to send progress reports to the Board of Control, including one report from Paris.
  - Recipient must be unmarried
  - Recipient must agree to submit a travel itinerary with budget, and a personal statement detailing what they plan to accomplish with the travel grant.

# Kuniyoshi Award Painting and Printmaking

Two awards of \$7,500 and full-time tuition for one class during the regular school year *In addition to the requirements listed above, the following details are specific to this grant:* 

- This grant is awarded to students of painting or printmaking in any medium or style
- If eligible a student may apply for both awards but may receive only one Kuniyoshi Award
- Past recipients of Mason, Kesson-Masterton, Lysun, Sherwood, or Brody Gaston Grants are not eligible for the painting award
- Past printmaking recipients of the Nessa Cohen Grant or the Will Barnet Grant are not eligible for the printmaking award

#### Nessa Cohen Grant

Two awards of up to \$5,000 and full-time tuition for one class during the regular school year *In addition to the requirements listed above, the following details are specific to this grant:* 

- Open only to students of sculpture, drawing, printmaking, and watercolor
- Students who have won this grant twice are no longer eligible

#### Ann and Bruno Lucchesi Grant

One award of \$3,000 and full-time tuition for one class during the regular school year *In addition to the requirements listed above, the following details are specific to this grant:* 

- Open only to students of traditional representational sculpture in clay
- Past double-recipients of the Nessa Cohen Grant and past recipients of the Lucchesi Grant are not eligible for this award

One award each of \$3,000 and one full-time class for the regular school year *In addition to the requirements listed above, the following details are specific to this grant:* 

- Open only to students of traditional representational painting in oil
- Past recipients of the Kuniyoshi, Mason, Kesson-Masterton, Lysun, Roux Grants are not eligible for this award

# Harvey & Lois Dinnerstein Grant for Realism

One award of \$1,000.

In addition to the requirements listed above, the following details are specific to this grant:

- Open only to students of traditional representational painting and drawing
- Past recipients of the Kuniyoshi, Mason, Kesson-Masterton, Lysun, Roux Grants are not eligible for this award

# **Lloyd Sherwood Grant**

Two awards of \$3,000 and one full-time class for the regular school year *In addition to the requirements listed above, the following details are specific to this grant:* 

- Open only to students of abstract painting or mixed media
- Past recipients of the Kuniyoshi, Sherwood, Brody Gaston, or Barnet Grants for abstract painting or mixed media are not eligible for this award

# Bruce Dorfman Grant for Mixed Media and Assemblage

One \$1,000 award of credit to the Art Students League Art Store and one full-time class for the regular school year

In addition to the requirements listed above, the following details are specific to this grant:

- Open only to students of Mixed Media and Assemblage
- Artwork must be mixed media assemblage

# Merit Scholarship Realism // Abstract // Semi-Abstract/Semi-Figurative

Full-time tuition for one class during the regular school year. Applicants must choose only ONE category for the merit competition. Past merit scholarship recipients are no longer eligible for the merit scholarship competition. Special awards may be available based on class registration. Partial tuition scholarships will also be available. For a full list of scholarship funds, please click here.
