SCHOOL LUNCH ORDERS

The Tylden General store provides a lunch order service for the school. Lunch orders are available on **Wednesday, Thursday & Friday**. Please write your child's name, room number and order on a brown paper lunch bag and enclose the money (cash only). The orders then should be placed in the lunch order tubs in the office area before 9am and returned to the school by 12.20pm. A new price list is included in this newsletter.

Please remember it is important to send a fruit snack and play lunch on days when your child has a lunch order.

BOOK COLLECTION & ACCOUNTS

Thank you to everyone for the prompt pick up of the book packs and uniform orders. Thank you also to the families who have settled the start of the year payments already. School statements will be sent home at the end of next week and it is helpful to the school if these expenses are finalised by the end of the term. Please have a word to Livia or Lee about your account if there are any difficulties with payment. We are happy to help you to develop a payment plan.

PAYMENTS TO THE SCHOOL

There are times when our office is not staffed, if you are leaving a payment, please place it in an envelope and leave it in the letter-box located near the office door.

Please send money in a sealed envelope with the child's name and grade, the purpose for the money and the amount. This saves confusion. Change is given, however, when possible it is appreciated if the correct amount is enclosed.

OUT OF SCHOOL HOURS CARE (OSHC)

The School Council runs our OSHC program on a not for profit basis. It complies with all federal and state regulations and is a high quality service. OSHC staff are all fully qualified and operate an excellent program. The coordinator is Hannah Lawrence.

Our school offers both Before School Care (BSC) and After School Care. (ASC). The fees are set by School Council and are currently \$22 per session for casual booking and \$24 per session for permanent bookings. OSHC programs operate under the National Quality Regulations. Our service uses the "Fully Booked" administration system, and the fortnightly bills include all rebates each family is entitled to receive. The Tylden PS OSHC service was established to meet the needs of our families. However, our OSHC program will only remain viable if school families continue to need and use it. The financial performance of the OSHC service is monitored closely by the School Council Finance Committee.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE (ASC)

After School Care (ASC) operates every afternoon 3:30 to 6 pm. Please ring the school office to book children into the service. Children attending are provided with afternoon tea and then they participate in indoor and outdoor activities under the guidance of our trained staff.

ASC bookings and cancellations must be made by **12pm on the day of the required session.** Like childcare centres, ASC fees are charged if the session has not been cancelled by the required time.

SHORT AND LONG SESSIONS OF BEFORE SCHOOL CARE (BSC)

The school runs both short and long sessions of Before School Care (BSC) daily. In BSC, children are provided with breakfast and then participate in activities under the guidance of trained staff.

- The short session of BSC costs \$10 and caters for families who only need
 care between 8am—8:40am. The short session especially assists parents/carers who need to get to work or to pre-school drop off,
 and find the 8:40am school arrival time awkward.
- The long session of BSC provides care between 6:30am—8:40am and costs the full rate of \$24 (for \$22 for permanent bookings.) BSC bookings are essential and cancellations for all BSC sessions must be made by **12pm on the day prior to the required session.** Like childcare centres, BSC fees are charged if the session has not been cancelled by the required time.

MESSAGES FROM THE PRINCIPAL

THE SCHOOL CROSSING



Please set the example and use the school crossing every time you cross Clowes Street. Show your children where to stand to check for traffic and explain how to wait until the cars have stopped, before they move onto the road. Re-

mind them to thank the driver for waiting with a smile or a wave.

As a driver, please be aware children do not develop good traffic awareness until around the age of 11 years. They will not always make good decisions, and we need to be ready for the unexpected when driving near the school.

Please take care to <u>park at the legal distance from the crossing</u>, so children can be seen clearly. There must be no exceptions to this, as accidents can occur in seconds. <u>Never drop off or pick up too</u> close to the crossing.

The rules are as follows:

When a children's crossing is in operation (ie. when the flags are displayed), you must not stop:

- on the school crossing
- within 20 metres of the crossing on the approach side
- within 20 metres of the crossing on the departure side You are not permitted to do a U-turn over the solid lines beside the crossing.

ARRIVAL TIME AT SCHOOL

The ideal time for children to arrive at school is around 8:45 am. This gives them time to unpack their school bag and get organised for the day, connect with some friends and have a short play before the bell at 9am.

Yard supervision at school starts at 8:40am. To ensure their safety, students should not arrive at school before the gates open at 8:40am. Students should not be dropped off and left unsupervised outside the school gates before 8:40am.

Please enquire at the office about the Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) service that runs daily before and after school. Before School Care operates from 6:30am—8:40am for parents who need to drop off children before 8:40am. Book at the office on the day prior to needing the service. Children receive breakfast and supervised activities before being taken to their classrooms at 8:40am.

END OF SCHOOL DAY

School finishes each day at 3:30pm. Please make sure your child knows who will collect them from school and where they will meet them.

If you are delayed unexpectedly but will arrive shortly after the bell, you can ring the school and we will let your child know so they do not worry. The child can then wait with the yard duty teacher. For longer delays, the child can be booked into After School Care until you arrive.

Children who remain at school after the last bus leaves will be booked into After School Care by the staff member on bus duty to ensure their safety until you arrive.

BIKE & SCOOTER SAFETY

Please advise all children riding bikes and scooters to and from school to leave from the Clowes Street 'bus gate' or the main gate near the school crossing. They should not leave through the gate that leads to the Clayton Street car park.

Children should cross Clowes Street at the crossing if they need to proceed to the south side of the road.

Those who stay on the north side of Clowes Street to go home, should cross Clayton Street at the corner where they are clearly visible to drivers.

For everyone's safety all children must dismount and wheel their bikes and scooters in the school grounds and on the paths beside the school.

PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL

Please be patient when parking and leaving from car parks. Help to maintain the school's good relationship with our neighbours, by <u>always keeping clear of their driveways</u>.

Always load and unload children from the 'footpath side' of the car.

Do not park in the bus zones.

Move slowly and be vigilant when driving, reversing and parking in the Clayton Street car park. Keep the disabled parking spaces free for those who need them and are displaying the required sticker.

LATE ARRIVAL AND EARLY DEPARTURE

Punctual attendance at school every day is extremely important.

Late arrivals can be unsettling for children and also interfere with their learning . A late arrival means the child misses making social connections with their friends before the bell, and misses part or all of their first learning activity for the day. Aim for arrival at school at 8:45am each day to give your child time to settle in before the bell.

Our emergency management procedures require the following:

- Always come to the office to sign students in if they are late to school. The students then receive a late pass to take to their classroom.
- Always come to the office to sign students out for an early departure. Office staff will collect the children from the classrooms if they need to leave early.
- If your child has forgotten something and you bring it to school after the bell, please take it to the office. The object will be delivered to your child by staff.

COMPETITION WINNER

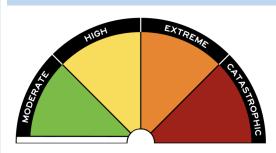


Congratulations to Ryan in grade 3 who entered a competition run by the Macedon Ranges Shire to redesign the library cards.

SCHOOL PROCEDURES FOR THE BUSHFIRE SEASON



The school develops and updates its Emergency Management Plan every year. This plan details what we will do to keep our students and staff safe if there is an emergency. Our school uses the oval or the Clayton Street car park as evacuation points. The red brick building is our safe refuge building if we are required to "shelter in place" during any emergency. We also have two "off site" evacuation points: the Tylden Hall and the Tylden Uniting Church. We do regular emergency drills to prepare students, and to test that our procedures work.

In this area, and at this time of year particularly, we are all very aware of the threat of fires. Every family is advised to have their own bushfire plan. **On days**

when there is an increased bushfire risk, every family should enact their plan. If this plan requires your family to leave the area, due to the heightened risk, then please advise the school of your child's absence. On days of high fire danger that are not deemed as Code Red, the school will operate as usual. Please note that when weather conditions are extreme, we minimise children's outside play time to keep them as comfortable as possible.

The way schools in Victoria respond to bushfires is constantly monitored, and reviewed as needed.

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools – and children's services – identified as being at highest bushfire risk have been included on the Bushfire-At Risk Register (BARR) and will be closed on days determined by fire authorities to be Code Red. Our school has been identified as a school at highest bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to three days notice of a planned closure following the issue of a Code Red warning by the CFA. We will contact you directly by email or letter sent home with your child with advice on planned closures and will confirm the decision to close by 12 noon the day before the planned closure.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child.

- No staff will be on site on Code Red days when the school is closed by the risk of fire.
- Out-of-school care will be cancelled on these days.
- School camps will be cancelled if the area where the camp is taking place is at risk.
- There may also be changes to school bus routes. Depending on routes, this may also occur on days when the school is not

On Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days, children should never be left at home unattended or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire-prone area, the safest option when a Code Red day is declared may be to leave the night before, or early in the morning of the Code Red day. As part of preparing our school for the threat of fire we have updated our emergency management plan; reprioritised any maintenance works that may assist in preparing for the threat of fire and cleared our school grounds. We also practise our emergency procedures with the children.

GENERAL INFORMATION

CAMPS & EXCURSION FUND

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) will provide payments for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply. \$125 per year is paid for eligible primary school students. Payments are made directly to the school and are tied to the student.

CSEF applications open from Term 1, 2023. Forms are available at the office. Parents or legal guardians are required to submit a new CSEF application form each year.

UPDATING RECORDS

It is important that all details we hold for your child at the school and for Out of School Hours Care are current and correct. If you have updated your mobile number, email address or postal address, changed employment or employee please advise the office by email or phone.

STUDENT ABSENCE NOTES REQUIRED

If your child is absent from school at any time you are required to contact the school, in person, by phone, through the Konnective app or by email, so office staff can inform your child's teacher.

Please give the reason for the absence. It is a legal requirement that the school receives an explanation for all student absences. The school will contact you if your child is absent and you have not provided an explanation. Please email to email to tylde.ps@education.vic.gov.au

SCHOLASTIC BOOKCLUB

Scholastic book club is one way the school fundraisers to purchase books for our library. We participate once a term and there is usually a two week turnaround from the due date. If your order the books as a gift and you do not want you your child to see them, could you advise the office.

Payment can be made online using the scholastic Loop system, paying with your credit card, or <u>cash only</u> to the school. Please don't pay into the school account

LUNCH UTENSILS

Supplying utensils—If an item your child s lunch box requires a spoon or fork, please remember to pack one in their lunch box.

PERSONAL GOODS BEING BROUGHT TO SCHOOL

Personal Items/property is often brought to school by students, staff and visitors. This can include mobile phones, electronic games, calculators, toys, musical instruments, sporting equipment, and cars parked on school premises. The DET does not hold insurance for personal property brought to school and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property.

VISITORS' BOOK AT OFFICE COUNTER

As part of our emergency procedures, we have a Visitors' Book at the office counter. Visitors who are staying for 15 minutes or longer must sign in at the office so there is a record of who is on the premises in case of emergency. This includes parent helpers who might be assisting with classroom programs such as classroom reading

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS (WWCC)

It is a requirement that parent helpers have a 'Working With Children' check. Those of you who are involved with sports clubs, youth groups or the like, will probably already have obtained your WWCC. There is no charge for a WWCC for volunteers, it just involves a bit of paperwork (and a photo). If you are a 'reading parent', or regularly help out with other class activities, a WWCC is required. Applications are done online and then processed through the Post Office. It takes a few weeks. You can name the school as the organisation where you volunteer, or another organisation if that suits you better. In the mean time, please continue to come along to school as usual. When your check comes through, take the card to the office so we can record the WWC number. Please come to the office and have a chat about this if you have any questions.
