This week in OSHC the children have continued there adventures around Australia and they travelled to the ACT. They looked at the population and talked about the mint that is located in Canberra, where our money is made.



All parents should have received a welcome email from XUNO last week and this week. If you have not received an email, please check your junk/spam folder. Its important to have all families registered as soon as possible.




