Mangoes will be in shorter supply, and prices are expected to be significantly higher this season than previous summers. As a result, boxes for this year's fundraiser will be 4.5kg, which is smaller than last year.

The boxes will still be excellent value and the mangoes will be of excellent quality and totally <u>DELICIOUS!</u> Order forms are due back at school by Thursday 26th October.


