Silent Auction

What is a 'Silent Auction' and how can I help?

The Silent Auction is always a very popular attraction at the fair and generates a large portion of our proceeds from the day. If you are new to the school or the concept of a Silent Auction, this is how it works. We set up the library with a range of goods that have been from local, regional and Melbourne businesses and individuals. With all the auction items displayed beautifully, people are able to walk around and note in front of each item the amount they are willing to bid for it. As the amounts rise throughout the day, the anticipation grows and the last 10 minutes are always fun as people try to outbid each other for their coveted item.

We are calling on our generous school community to donate for the auction, or to contact anyone you think may be willing to donate – single items, hampers, vouchers for services, accommodation, dining and so on. If you assisted in sourcing goods last year from a business or are new to the school and think you may have some contacts, we would greatly appreciate your efforts. Working with Children Checks (WWCC) required for volunteers at the Fair

Child Safety regulations recommend that parents/carers helping at school and school events like the fair have a 'Working With Children Check'. Those of you who are involved with sports clubs, youth groups or the like, will probably already have obtained your WWC. There is no charge for a WWC check for volunteers, it just involves a bit of paperwork (and a photo). Applications are done online and then processed through the Post office. It takes a few weeks. You can name the school as the organisation where you volunteer, or another organisation if that suits you better. When your check comes through, take the card to the office so we can record the WWC number. Please come to the office & have a chat about this if you have any questions.

Mystery Jars

Start filling your mystery jars! The kids go crazy for these little jars of fun. We ask each family to provide at least one mystery jar for the fair. You need a clean jar, and can fill them with balloons, hair ties, small toys and stationery items, stickers, water bombs, crafts bits and pieces, non-perishable food treats, basically anything you know your children would love to find in a mystery jar. Please ensure items are new and the recycled jars are nice and clean. They can be dropped off at the office at anytime.


