## RED LENTIL, TOMATO \& PUMPKIN

ngredients: (serves 6)
450 g pumpkin or sweet potato
6 medium tomatoes
500 g dried red lentils
3 cm knob ginger
2 red chillie
3 tablespoons olive oil
3 litres MASSEL vegetable stoc
$11 / 2$ teaspoon garam masala
300 ml tomato puree
$11 / 2$ teaspoon sugar
Salt to taste
Method:

1. Dice pumpkin or sweet potato into 3 cm squares. Chop tomatoes roughly and finely chop the ginger, chillies and garlic.
2. Rinse and drain the lentils.
3. Add olive oil to a large saucepan over medium heat. Add ginger and garlic and fry until aromatic, then add lentils, chilli and garam masala and stir through to coat.
4. Add $21 / 2$ litres of stock, bring to boil and simmer for 30 minutes or until the lentils have broken down
5. Add remaining stock if the lentils become too thick
6. Add fresh tomatoes and tomato puree and simmer for a further 15 minutes
sugar, stir to combine, then taste for Seasoning
and add salt if required.

BEEF KORMA WITH POTATO

## Ingredients: (serves 6)

1.5 kg beef, cut into 4 cm chunks
2 tbs oil
2 onions, sliced
3 garlic cloves, chopped
5 cm piece of ginger, peeled and chopped
1 tsp ground cumin
1 tsp ground nutmeg
1 tsp ground cinnamon
1 tsp garam masala
$1 / 2$ tsp red chilli powder 3 bay leaves
2 dried red chilies
2/3 cup MASSEL chicken stock
1 cup thick Greek style yogurt
250 grams sour cream
500 g potatoes, peeled and cut into 3 cm pieces
Method

1. Preheat the oven to 160 degrees. Season the beef with salt.



-4 minutes until softened.
2. Add garlic and ginger and cook for another minute. Add
 seconds. Add yogurt, stock and sour cream then stir to combine.
3. Return beef to the casserole dish, season with salt and pepper and bring to a simmer over medium heat.
4. Cover surface with baking paper cut to size, then pop on a lid and place in a oven for 2 hours or until the meat is tender.
5. Meanwhile, place potatoes in a saucepan of salted water,
boil for 12-15 minutes until tender, then drain.


## EASY BUTTER CHICKEN






3. Add the chicken, tomato paste, tomato puree. Cook for

 10 minutes stirring occasionally.
