EASY BUTTER CHICKEN

Ingredients:

2 tablespoons oil

50g butter

1 medium onion

1 small can of tomato paste

1 ½ cups tomato puree (pasata)

1 cup heavy cream (can substitute coconut cream)

1 teaspoon fresh ginger (minced or grated)

2-3 cloves finely minced garlic

1.6kg boneless, skinless chicken thighs

2 teaspoons garam masala

1 teaspoon chilli powder

3 teaspoon ground coriander

2 teaspoon ground fennel

3 teaspoon cumin 1 teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon black pepper

1. Heat a large skillet or medium saucepan over medium to high heat. Add oil, butter and onions and cook onions down until lightly golden (3-4 minutes)

2. Add spices, garlic and ginger - cook for 20 seconds

3. Add the chicken, tomato paste, tomato puree. Cook for 5-6 minutes or until everything is cooked through. 4. Add the heavy cream, salt and pepper and simmer for 8-10 minutes stirring occasionally.

BEEF KORMA WITH POTATO

ngredients: (serves 6)

1.5 kg beef, cut into 4cm chunks

2 tbs oil

2 onions, sliced

3 garlic cloves, chopped

5cm piece of ginger, peeled and chopped

1 tsp ground cumin

1 tsp ground nutmeg

1 tsp ground cinnamon

1 tsp garam masala

1/2 tsp red chilli powder 3 bay leaves

2 dried red chilies

2/3 cup MASSEL chicken stock

1 cup thick Greek style yogurt

250 grams sour cream

500 g potatoes, peeled and cut into 3 cm pieces

Method

Preheat the oven to 160 degrees. Season the beef with salt.

RED LENTIL, TOMATO & PUMPKIN

Ingredients: (serves 6)

450 g pumpkin or sweet potato

6 medium tomatoes

500g dried red lentils

3cm knob ginger

3 garlic cloves

2 red chillies

3 tablespoons olive oil

3 litres MASSEL vegetable stock

1 1/2 teaspoon garam masala 300 ml tomato puree

1 1/2 teaspoon sugar

Salt to taste

1. Dice pumpkin or sweet potato into 3cm squares. Chop tomatoes roughly and finely chop the ginger, chillies and garlic.

2. Rinse and drain the lentils.

3. Add olive oil to a large saucepan over medium heat. Add lentils, chilli and garam masala and stir through to ginger and garlic and fry until aromatic, then add

4. Add 2 1/2 litres of stock, bring to boil and simmer for 30 minutes or until the lentils have broken down.

5. Add remaining stock if the lentils become too thick.

6. Add fresh tomatoes and tomato puree and simmer for a further 15 minutes

7. Add sugar, stir to combine, then taste for Seasoning and add salt if required.
