COVID-19 COMMUNITY TASK FORCE

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting lockdown, Clear Path for Veterans launched the COVID-19
Community Task Force. Targeting food insecurity, unemployment, and social isolation, the Task Force implemented emergency food pantry support, mental health triage, career services support, virtual programming, and activity boxes for Veterans and military families.
Implementing the Buddy Check Program, Clear Path had over 2,000 conversations keeping Veterans connected and engaged with Clear Path and each other.

930 meals to over 271 Veterans, additionally impacting 437 family members, including 87 children.

2,939 Buddy Check calls and 239 mental health calls made.



2,715 Interactions with Veterans, family members, & their caregivers

Thanksgiving Meal Kits provided a complete Thanksgiving dinner to 278 individuals, including 81 children and 125 seniors across 16 counties.

PEER PROGRAM

Clear Path for Veterans Peer Team's focus throughout 2020 was combating the massive food insecurity found within the Veteran community. Clear Path's Peer Mentors played a major role as part of the COVID-19 Community Task Force, delivering over 930 emergency food pantry boxes in 2020. Taking an active role in the Task Force's Buddy Check Program the Peers worked to help Veterans that were struggling with social isolation.

The Annual Thanksgiving meal at Clear Path normally serves 200 Veterans but due to this year's environment, the meal was brought to the Veterans. The Peer Team organized the delivery of 194 Thanksgiving meal kits which served over 278 individuals across 16 counties.

WARRIORS WORKING

The Warriors Working program empowers Veterans to enter the workforce by equipping them with the necessary skills and training to ensure success in achieving their career goals. In 2020 the Warriors Working Program provided over 250 Veterans with employment support and helped place 19 in meaningful jobs, 3 of them with companies in contract with Warriors Working. Despite the economic challenges, we added two companies to this list including Hill Rom in Skaneateles, NY for a total of 17 companies our program has a partnership with in hiring the Veterans we serve.

Additionally, with the help of our great volunteers, the Warriors Working Team provided resume and interviewing skills workshops to transitioning soldiers and their spouses at Ft. Drum. These were done both in-person and remotely. We will continue to provide these services to Ft. Drum quarterly in 2021.



INTERNAL PROGRAMS

2020 started out strong with Integrative Medicine and social engagement activities like bingo, terrarium workshops, wood carving sessions, and more. There were offsite trips to the International Boxing Hall of Fame and to the Rochester Community Inclusive Rowing. In March, things shifted to a virtual platform to host an Egg Hunt online with 2 full weeks of activities.

Activity and Wellness boxes were designed with a focus on promoting family connection and introducing new hobbies. Golf meetups with Clear Path's Community Outreach Manager took place throughout the spring and summer months with great success.

In 2021 the Social Engagement and Integrative Medicine programs will be a mix of virtual and in-person activities, both on and off the Clear Path campus.



CANINE PROGRAM

The Canine Program harnesses the healing power of Canine Companionship through training and matching fully-trained service dogs with Veterans impacted by their time in service. In 2020 the Canine Program acquired five purpose-bred English Labrador Retriever puppies who joined the other service dogs in training in the Puppy Development Program. At the close of 2020, the program had 10 service dogs in training. Two owner-trainer teams completed their training and graduated as certified service dog teams. The Canine Guardian Program welcomed 14 new Canine Guardian families to the program. The Canine Team also grew to include a Client Services Coordinator and a Canine Care Technician. Currently, the Canine Program is a candidate program with Assistance Dogs International (ADI). Program candidacy provides invaluable information and networking related to the service dog industry. The Canine Program is on track to become an ADI Accredited Program by the close of 2021.







2020 EVENTS

Despite the pandemic, Clear Path for Veterans adapted its fundraising events to a virtual event platform that kept all participants safe and allowed them to support Clear Path from the comfort of their own backyards.



OPERATION HEROES

The 2020 "Tour de Clear Path" event evolved into Operation Heroes; a virtual run, walk, bike event allowing participants to raise funds for Clear Path, while getting outside.



VIETNAM VETERANS APPRECIATION OPEN

Following all health and safety protocols, Clear Path hosted the first Vietnam Veterans Appreciation Open at Pompey Golf Club. The event was the most successful golf tournament to date.



RIDE FOR CLEAR PATH

2020 was the 8th annual Ride for Clear Path for Veterans motorcycle ride. Although unable to host the event at the Clear Path campus as in years past, the event was run on a virtual platform. This allowed participants and clubs to ride wherever and whenever they wanted through the month of September. Long term supporter of the Ride for Clear Path, the Southern Hills Posse Motorcycle Club still successfully held their yearly raffle for Clear Path despite the pandemic.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Clear Path for Veterans saw a tremendous increase in community support and in-kind donations in 2020 due in part to the effects of COVID-19. In-kind donations included everything from personal protective equipment (PPE) to food and other non-perishable items for emergency pantry boxes. Clear Path for Veterans and in-turn the COVID-19 Community Task Force would not have had such a successful 2020 without the community standing alongside us to support our mission.



2020 Fundraising Highlights







CLEAR PATH AFFILIATE

CLEAR PATH FOR VETERANS NEW ENGLAND

One of the most exciting 2020 accomplishments for Clear Path for Veterans New England (CPV NE) was the completion of the 22,000 square foot renovation of the former Fort Devons Army HQs building/Hospital. Completion of the capital project will increase capacity in terms of community meals, employment, community and volunteer engagement, peer-to-peer support, delivery of additional wellness services, and increased placement of service and emotional support dogs.

Meeting basic needs in the veteran and military community was a major theme in 2020. The CPV NE Peer Team were called on to aid with housing, financial, benefit and employment services. We provided 16,000 emergency pantry boxes, of note, 62% were over 60 and 20% were families that had children under 2. 82 backpacks were also filled with school supplies to children of military and Veteran families.

There were 525 volunteers throughout the year that contributed 5,027 volunteer hours. Social Engagement programming consisted of flag building workshops, deep-sea fishing outings, and 259 instances of outdoor recreation therapy activities serving over 160 Veterans and their family members.





CLEAR PATH BEYOND CENTRAL NEW YORK

SOUTHERN TIER

Throughout 2020 Jonathan Wanglund, Peer Support Manager and Katina SinClair, Community Outreach Coordinator for Clear Path's Southern Tier office, were able to focus their efforts on working with Clear Path's COVID-19 Community Task Force. The team served 800 Veterans across the Southern Tier. Delivering Thanksgiving and Christmas meal kits to the Veterans in their three-county coverage area ensured that Veterans were well-fed during the holidays.



Throughout the year, certificates and thank you cards were delivered to Veterans living in assisted living homes, particularly

over Veterans Day. Events such as The Broome County Veterans Expo, Give Back Gala, Vietnam Veterans Pinning Ceremony, and Broome County Board Of Realtors were attended. In addition, there was a continued collaboration with The Good Shepherd Nursing Home and Willow Point Nursing Home, Binghamton VA, and various agencies in Broome/Tioga/Chenango Counties. Veteran outings and recreational activities encouraging connectivity were executed including a trip to Destiny USA Mall, Korean Veterans Breakfast, and lunch at Castle Gardens Hearth.



2020 EXPANSION

HUDSON VALLEY

In 2020 Clear Path for Veterans expanded into the Hudson Valley region in partnership with the Hudson Valley Veterans
Administration at Castle Point. Peter Maraday, Clear Path's Hudson Valley Peer Support Manager, will be working directly with the Castle Point VA staff to provide Clear Path's Peer Mentorship Program services to the counties of Sullivan, Orange, Rockland, Westchester, Putnam, and Dutchess.

Although initial programming will be focused on providing Clear Path's Peer Program support and services long-term goals will be to offer Warriors Working, Social Engagement, and Canine programming to the Veterans, military members, and their family members that reside within the Hudson Valley region.

LOOKING AHEAD

CULINARY FOOD TRAILER

In 2021 Clear Path for Veterans will be expanding its culinary operations to include a 7 x 12 food trailer custom made by Mohawk Valley Welding Company based out of Utica, NY. This project was made possible by the support of Chobani and SEFCU as well as the mentorship of the Central New York Food Truck Alliance.

Clear Path's food trailer will allow the Culinary Team to bring the canteen model mobile, reaching Veterans across the 33 counties that Clear Path serves in New York. Not only will it provide a nutritious meal and an opportunity for camaraderie and connection with other Veterans that attend, the food trailer will also serve as a financial sustainability portion of Clear Path.



10 YEARS OF SUPPORTING THE JOURNEY HOME

In September 2021 Clear Path for Veterans will be celebrating 10 years of supporting the journey home for Veterans, military members, and their families.

Throughout the 2021 year Melissa Spicer, Clear Path's cofounder and current Board Member will be sharing the story of its inception and its journey to becoming the premiere Veteran Service Agency in New York State.
