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## Financial Report 1st quarter 2022

### Headlines

During the 1st quarter 2022, Skandi Hercules, Skandi Skansen and Skandi Vinland have been on charter contracts to the DOF Subsea Group – Skandi Hercules to the Asia Pacific region, Skandi Skansen to the North America and Atlantic region and Skandi Vinland to the North America region.

### Q1 Operations

Skandi Skansen has been working on a mooring project in the Gulf of Mexico most of the quarter and commenced on the Hywind Tampen project for Atlantic region in the end of first quarter.

Skandi Hercules has in the quarter been working on various construction and IMR projects, mainly in Australian waters.

Skandi Vinland is on a long-term charter contract to the DOF Subsea North America region where she is operating under a 10-year IMR contract with Husky Energy off the East Coast of Canada. 4th of April 2022, Skandi Vinland sailed to Denmark to undertake the 5 year class docking.

### Statement of comprehensive income

The operating revenue for the 1st quarter of 2022 was NOK 49 million (NOK 29 million in 1st quarter of 2021). The EBITDA was NOK 43 million (NOK 12 million), whilst the EBIT was NOK 19 million (negative NOK 9 million) after depreciation and impairment of NOK 24 million (NOK 20 million). Net financial loss was NOK 29 million (loss of NOK 22 million), and the loss after tax was NOK 10 million (loss of NOK 106 million).

### Statement of financial position

Total assets were NOK 2 161 million (NOK 2 110 million), where non-current assets amounted to NOK 1 447 million (NOK 1 490 million). Current assets amounted to NOK 714 million (NOK 620 million), of which NOK 605 million (NOK 503 million) was cash and cash equivalents.

Total equity was NOK 650 million (NOK 689 million). Current liabilities were NOK 1 511 million (NOK 1 421 million), of which NOK 1 483 million (NOK 1 402 million) was current portion of debt. The company has converted NOK loans of 1 002 million and CAD loans of NOK 439 million to USD loans in Q1 2022. At quarter end the book equity ratio was 30 %.

### Statement of cash flows

Net cash flow from operating activities for the 1st quarter of 2022 was NOK 49 million (NOK 16 million). Cash flow from investing activities was nil (negative NOK 19 million). Cash

flow from financing activities was negative NOK 6 million (nil). Cash and cash equivalents at the end of the period were NOK 605 million (NOK 503 million). The Company and the Group have standstill agreements with majority of the lenders and no interest and instalments have been paid during the standstill period. Installment in period is related to settlement of other debt.

### Finance and Capital Structure

The restructuring of the DOF Subsea Group's debt is ongoing and standstill agreements have been agreed until the 31st of May 2022 with 95% of the secured lenders within the DOF Subsea Group.

The BNDES standstill agreement for DOF Subsea Brasil expired in June 2021 and the company has since then paid debt service according to refinancing agreements signed in February 2020.

The DOF Subsea Group standstill agreements assume payment of principal and interest of a NOK 100 million credit facility provided by certain lenders in March 2020. The outstanding amount of this facility was NOK 47 million by the end of March 2022. The relevant Group company has imposed unilateral standstill to the secured lender not participating in the standstill agreements.

The bondholders in DOFSUB07, DOFSUB08 and DOFSUB09 have on 29th of April approved extension of the standstill agreement until 31st of May and with the authority for the Ad-hoc group to extend the standstill period until 30th of September.

The DOFCON Brasil JV is not part of the standstill agreements and serves its debt according to the terms in the relevant loan facilities. Financial covenants related to the Group's 50% guarantees of the DOFCON facilities have been waived.

Even though the markets have improved the Group is not in a position to pay its debt without a significant debt reduction. Therefore, the Group will continue its constructive dialogue with the creditors to secure a long-term and robust financial solution. The current debt restructuring proposal include conversion of a significant amount of debt to equity and softer terms on several of the Group's loan facilities.

The Group (excluding the DOFCON JV) does not generate sufficient cash flow to service its current outstanding debt. Therefore, a reduction in debt is necessary. It is further a prerequisite that all conversion of debt, including the debt in the subsidiaries, is done in DOF ASA. Although the dialogue with the creditors is constructive, no assurance can at this stage be given that a satisfactory solution to the Group's debt situation will be found.

The Group and the Company aims to achieve a natural hedge between cash flows and cash outflows and have secured debt funding in equivalent currency as the earnings from firm contracts. The remaining exchange risk has historically been secured through forward FX contracts. The Group further aims to reduce the interest risk. Due to the Group's financial position, it has become more challenging to secure interest forward contracts (swap contracts) and FX contracts. Hence, the Group's and the Company's liquidity exposure have increased due to volatility in interest and FX rates. The Company is further exposed to P&L and balance risk due to volatility in currency.

### Shareholders

The number of outstanding shares is 33 931 000, with a book value of NOK 19.15 per share. DOF Subsea AS owns 85.15% of the shares. The remaining 14.85% of the shares is held by 31 shareholders. Of that, Euroclear Bank S.A./N.V. owns 4.43%, Meteva AS owns 1.86%, MP Pensjon PK owns 1.50%, AS Clipper owns 1.08% and AS Straen owns 1.08%. The remaining shareholders own less than 1.00%.

### Outlook

The O&G markets have improved as several regions have seen increased activity in all the Group's segments. The tender activity is high. The current situation in Eastern-Europe has however continued to create instability in the world economy. The Group's financial position is not sustainable and the Group has since 2nd quarter 2020 operated in an environment with short-term standstill agreements and is dependent on a long-term refinancing solution to continue as going concern. If the Group cannot be treated as going concern the valuation of the Group's assets will be further revised and will result in significant impairment of the Group's assets.

The 1st quarter report is prepared on the assumption of going concern and this assumption is based on agreed standstill agreements (applicable until 31st of May 2022) with the majority of the Group's lenders. The debt restructuring currently discussed include conversion of substantial amounts of debt to equity. The dialogue with the lenders has continued to be constructive and progress has been made so far into 2022, but there are still some issues pending, and a refinancing solution is not yet in place.

In parallel with the ongoing debt restructuring, the management and Board have continued the focus on operational and cost efficiency improvements and on implementation of new technology and digital solutions. In response to the ongoing shift in the energy markets and future customer requirements, the Group has a strong forward-looking focus on developing strategic opportunities and new lines of business utilising the Group's combined fleet, services, and competence within the limitations of the financial position due to the debt restructuring of the Group.

The Board and Management have since the 2nd quarter 2019 been working on a long-term refinancing solution for the Group which included discussions with the banks, the bondholders, and the main shareholders.

The restructuring of the Group's debt is ongoing and standstill agreements have been agreed until the 31st of May 2022 with 95% of the secured lenders within the DOF Subsea Group. The BNDES standstill agreement for DOF Subsea Brasil expired in June 2021 and the DOF Subsea Brasil has since then paid debt service according to refinancing agreements signed in February 2020.

The DOF Subsea standstill agreements assume payment of principal and interest of a NOK 100 million credit facility provided by certain lenders in March 2020. The outstanding amount of this facility was NOK 47 million by end of December. The relevant Group company has imposed unilateral standstill to the secured lender not participating in the standstill agreements.

The bondholders in DOFSUB07, DOFSUB08 and DOFSUB09 have on 29th of April 2022 approved extension of the standstill agreement until 31st of May and with the authority for the Ad-hoc group to extend the standstill period until 30th of September 2022.

The DOFCON JV is not part of the standstill agreements and serves its debt according to the terms in the relevant loan facilities. Financial covenants related to the Group's 50% guarantees of the DOFCON facilities have been waived.

The dialogue with the lenders has continued to be constructive and progress has been made in the quarter and so far into 2022. There are still some issues pending, hence a refinancing solution is not yet in place. The debt restructuring proposal currently discussed include conversion of debt to equity. The secured debt is, in accordance with IFRS, classified as current debt at the 31st of March 2022.

This classification is based on the Group's financial situation and standstill agreements of debt service with the banks and bondholders.

### Financial covenants

The financial covenants are suspended through the standstill agreements. However, the loan agreements of the Company and the Group include the following covenants (based on the proportionate consolidation method of accounting for joint ventures):

· The fair value of the Company's vessels shall always be at least 110-125% of the outstanding loan amount

In addition to the above-mentioned financial covenants, the guarantor (DOF Subsea AS) on a consolidated basis should fulfil the waived covenants (based on the proportionate consolidation method of accounting for joint ventures):

- The Group shall have available cash of at least NOK 500 million at all times
- The Group shall have value-adjusted equity to value-adjusted assets of at least 30%
- The Group shall have book equity of at least NOK 3 000 million at all time
- · The Group shall have positive working capital at all times, excl. current portion of debt to credit institutions
- · The fair value of the Group's vessels shall always be at least 110-130% of the outstanding loan amount.

DOF Subsea AS has further received waiver for the financial covenants as guarantor for two facilities in the joint venture with TechnipFMC. If waivers are not extended, it is a significant risk that the Company and the Group will be in breach of its covenants.

### Note 7 Going Concern

This Financial Report has been prepared in accordance with the standard for interim reporting (IAS 34). The Financial Report does not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the Company's Annual Report for 2020. The Financial Report is unaudited.

The Financial Report is prepared on the assumption of a going concern. However, the Company and the Group's financial situation is at risk as a long-term financing solution is not in place. The Board of Directors and the Management are working on a long-term financial solution for the Group. If the negotiations are not successful for the Group, this may affect the 'going concern' assumption.

### Note 8 Events after period end

#### **Finance**

The Group has agreed to further extend the principal and interest suspension agreements with, or received extensions of similar concessions from, secured lenders representing in total 95 % of the secured debt of companies within the Group (excluding DOF Subsea Brasil Servicos Ltda.) until 31st of May 2022. The bondholders in DOFSUB07, DOFSUB08 and DOFSUB09 have on 29th of April approved extension of the standstill agreement until 31st of May and with the authority for the Ad-hoc group to extend the standstill period until 30th of September. The extensions of the standstill periods will facilitate the Group's continued dialogue with its secured lenders and the bondholders under the Group's bonds regarding a long-term financial restructuring of the DOF group.

### Note 9 Performance measurement definitions

### Alternative performance measurements

The Company presents alternative performance measurements (APM) that are regularly reviewed by management and aim to enhance the understanding of the Company's performance. APMS are calculated consistently over time and are based on financial data presented in accordance with IFRS and other operational data as described in the table below.
