Background & purpose of the IC3 Movement

The International Career and College Counseling (IC3) Movement is a global effort to establish career and college counseling in every school. Our mission is for young people to get the support they need for purpose and direction in their lives. In collaboration with leaders across high schools, universities, educational organizations and industry, IC3 aims to cultivate learning, networking, and professional development for the community through events and initiatives that sensitize, elevate, and develop the career and college counseling profession. Founded in 2016, IC3's initiatives have witnessed participation from educators from 90+ countries and have directly impacted more than 2,800 high schools globally that are serving more than 1.3 million high school students.

Committee overview

The committee consists of members chosen from a wide range of countries across the globe and is led by a chair and co-chair. This committee will play a critical role in furthering the career and college counseling profession through the IC3 Movement.

The primary focus of the committee is to invite participation and garner support for IC3 initiatives (Annual IC3 Conference & Expo, IC3 Regional Forums, and IC3 Institute). Another key focus is to sensitize high school and university colleagues on the criticality and need for career and college counseling.

The next phase of the IC3 Africa committee will be focused on supporting the mission of the IC3 Movement with working groups. These are a limited number of project-based, time-bound working groups to carry priority committee initiatives forward.

Committee members will drive public opinion on counseling and support the overall goal of assisting the IC3 Movement in reaching a broader audience across Africa. This will be accomplished by creating, preparing, and promoting content to be shared actively through various channels, including social media, written and video blogs, webinars, etc. IC3 Leaders attending global events and conferences on behalf of their respective institutions would also play the role of IC3 ambassadors during such events.



General responsibilities of IC3 Leaders

- While taking individual action, leaders represent the IC3 Movement (Annual IC3 Conference & Expo, IC3 Regional Forums) and the IC3 Institute
- Commit to regularly reviewing all IC3 materials and websites and fully understand IC3's mission, policies, programs, and events
- Commit to accurately presenting information on IC3
- Ideate and define content that will be most valuable for participants at various IC3 events
- Actively monitor session content during IC3 events and provide feedback after these events
- Garner in-person feedback from participants at IC3 events to continue enhancing IC3 content for future events
- Track and announce important IC3 developments within their networks

Responsibilities of IC3 Africa Committee Leaders

- Seek to maximize participation across IC3 initiatives (Annual IC3 Conference & Expo, IC3 Regional Forums, and IC3 Institute) with the goal of engaging educators from 100+ countries
- Facilitate stakeholder engagements with the school heads in the African region
- Fostering engagement with universities in the African region
- Support the 2024 IC3 Regional Forums in the Africa region by identifying session proposals/speakers, conducting outreach for the participation of high schools, universities, and educational organizations, and identifying schools to host the IC3 Regional Forums in the future
- Promoting the IC3 Institute Training Programs in the region and supporting the recruitment
- Supporting the promotion of the IC3 Scholarship Program and actively look for deserving candidates within the high school community

- Recognition in the educational community at a local and international level (universities and schools from all over the world attend IC3 events)
- Recognition in the online community through all forms of engagement on social media
