Ukraine Today: Under Siege, Yet Resilient

As Russia's war rages on, Ukrainian citizens bear its terrible burden. Homes and entire communities are destroyed. Air raids are a constant. Casualties and injuries are mounting. While the resilience of the Ukrainian people is renowned, they are living on the edge.

Despite considerable global support, most philanthropic funding hasn't reached the country. And the needs are only growing. Food, medicine, medical supplies, and other basic necessities are running short. Civilians remain cut off and vulnerable. And while the people best equipped to handle this crisis are those on the ground, they lack swift and regular access to global resources.

BlueCheck Ukraine is a group of experts committed to providing direct funding to local NGOs and grassroots organizations on the ground in Ukraine. Backed by more than 30 years of combined experience in humanitarian aid and expertise across various industries, we have created an end-to-end solution for identifying, vetting, verifying and fast-tracking funds to local NGOs, powered by our 501c3 sponsor, Nova Ukraine, and the due diligence services of Ropes and Gray and Integrity Risk International. We ensure funding arrives in the right place and to the right people in Ukraine, and swiftly deploy much-needed financial resources directly to them, as, responsibly and efficiently as possible.

We support:

- Emergency medical care and medicine distribution
- Trauma and first aid training
- Food & relief supply distribution
- Emergency evacuations of trapped families
- Mental health services for Ukrainians
- Cash assistance to internally displaced people
- Care for children with special needs
- Support for elderly people in besieged areas
- Shelter rehabilitation
- Unexploded ordnance removal

By decentralizing and localizing the disbursement of aid, we are shifting the humanitarian assistance paradigm.

Why BlueCheck? Humanitarian Aid is Falling Short

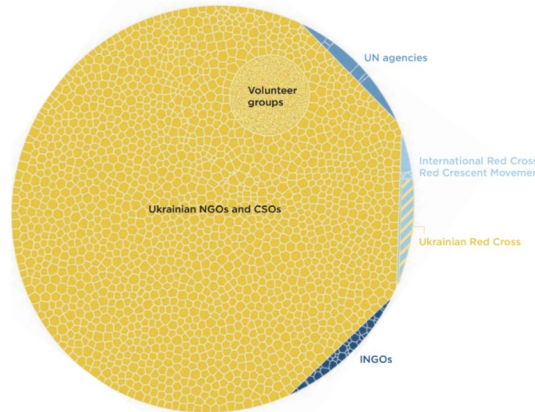
As of May 2022, more than £2.15bn has been donated to Ukraine-related humanitarian response efforts since February – more than any other crisis this year. But a recent review by Humanitarian Outcomes, funded by the UK Humanitarian Innovation Hub, concluded that about 85% is being held by international aid organisations who are scarcely present in Ukraine and have yet to spend the majority of the money.

The report found that despite “informal” Ukrainian volunteer groups and NGOs providing “virtually all” humanitarian aid, they have received only 0.24% – or £5.3m - of the direct donations to Ukraine.

The yellow segment represents local Ukrainian NGOs, as a measure of operational presence.

Figure 1: Operational presence

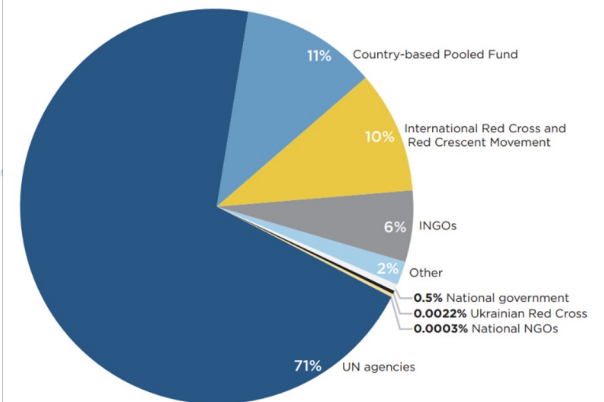
Humanitarian providers inside Ukraine are depicted here by number of organizations and their average staff size.
