## THOUGHTS FROM THE SERMON

- 3. What sustained Paul in the hard times? Why did putting his trust in Jesus make a difference?
- 4. How is the biblical definition of hope different from Webster's? Define biblical hope in your own words. *Read: Psalm 33:16-22, Psalm 130:7, 1 Timothy 6:17, Romans 8:23-24a, Romans 15:12b-13*
- 5. What is the Holy Spirit's role in those trying circumstances in our life? As believers who can we count on to always be by our side no matter what?
- 6. As we mature as Christians, what else should mature and why? What does that maturity help us do? Read: Acts 23:12-15, Acts 24:1-9, Acts 25:1-5, Acts 23:11b, 1 Peter 1:13-16, 1 Corinthians 13:7, 1 Thessalonians 1:2-3
- 7. What kind of persecution is Paul facing? How does he respond to this persecution?
- 8. Have you ever been persecuted for your faith in Jesus? If so, tell your story?
