THOUGHTS FROM THE SERMON

1. What stood out to you in this week's sermon? What were your biggest takeaways?

Read: 1 John 5:13, 1 John 1:5-10, Exodus 3:1-6, Psalm 119:105, 119:130, John 1:5, Psalm 43:3-5, Psalm 27:1, Psalm 18:27-28, Isaiah 60:1-3

- 2. How was the light described in the Old Testament? What example do we see God's purity and light coming together?
- 3. Why was Moses fearful as he encountered God? What other description was given to the light in the Old Testament?
- 4. In what ways are God's Word and salvation light? Describe the light Isaiah is seeing. Why should this give us hope?

Read: Job 24:13-17, 1 John 1:6, 1 John 1:8, 10

- 5. What do the people of darkness claim about a relationship with God and their faith?
- 6. How do they view sin? What about their capability to sin? Instead of admitting they are liars and sinners, they claim what about God?

Read: 1 John 1:7, 1 John 1:9, James 5:16

- 7. In what ways is the fellowship of the people of light different from that of the people of darkness? How do we show that we genuinely love one another?
- 8. How must the people of light approach their sin? What is God's promise to us if we do confess our sins?

Pray: We would get an opportunity to share the good news of the Gospel with someone and the joy that is found in Jesus with someone this week.

Read: 1 John 5:13, 1 John 1:5-10, Exodus 3:1-6, Psalm 119:105, 119:130, John 1:5, Psalm 43:3-5, Psalm 27:1, Psalm 18:27-28, Isaiah 60:1-3, Job 24:13-17, James 5:16.
