Non-Discretionary Costs

Student Fees – as advertised to you in your offer letter

QQI Making of Award (certification) – final year only – estimated at approximately €200 Registration fees – as advertised to you in your offer letter

Administrative fees – as advertised to you in your offer letter

Resit fees – €100 per paper (up to 300 EUR) in any given resit period

Living costs in Ireland, estimated at around €7,000 per annum

Tax Relief

Any programme undertaken at Holmes Institute Dublin is approved for tax relief at the standard rate of income tax. The person who has paid the fees may claim the relief.

The maximum amount of income tax relief you can claim is €7,000 per course, per person, per academic year.

Each claim is subject to a single disregard amount of €3,000 (FT) or €1,500 (PT) each tax year.
