Arthur Berger's compositional output is small. These five short works, none longer than fifteen minutes-Ideas of Order, Perspectives II, Polyphony, Serenade Concertante, and Prelude, Aria and Waltz-comprise his entire orchestral effort, and several of these pieces are themselves re-workings of previous settings. These compositions span five decades, yet Berger's language has an unmistakable underlying consistency. Two identifiable ingredients characterize these symphonic works: beautiful surface textures juxtaposed with adventurous rhythmic and harmonic experimentation. The former make each work compelling from the first listen; the latter reward careful study and reveal the depth of Berger's craft.
