

Born in Michigan but for most of his life a true Californian, Robert Erickson had a reputation as a maverick. His musical path was never a straight line, nor, really, a line at all but a landscape, with ranges of features rather than mere points of interest. He was a profound and original musical thinker who embraced the expressive possibilities of all music, from the Western classics and moderns of his own early education to Indian and Balinese traditions and all manner of contemporary experimentation, as long as it served a musical purpose. These four works—*Night Music, Fantasy* for Cello and Orchestra, *East of the Beach, Auroras*—all (except *Night Music*) world-premiere recordings, represent the best of his orchestral output, including the piece considered its apex, *Auroras*.
