## Who is the school board?



The school board in Philadelphia is the governmental body that is appointed by the mayor made up 9 members and 2 nonvoting student members. The school board forms most of the policies that govern the school district, from discipline policies, to school closures, to budgeting they are the ones ultimately able to make many decisions.

# Why testify at a meeting?



The school board meets multiple times a month to hear and make decisions on many pieces of policies in the district. These meeting are public and are on a calendar on philasd.org. A large part of this meeting is a space where the public can voice their opinion, each speaker has 3 minutes to talk infront of the board. This is a clear and specific place for you as a student to voice your opinion!

# URBED

### **BEFORE**

- 1. Make sure you are registered to speak at the board meeting. Call (215) 400-5959 or register at philasd.org.
- 2. Prepare a statement! Have a written piece with strong research and experience based points.

#### **DURING**

- 1. Deliver your message loudly and clearly.
- 2. Be prepared to make edits to your statement while listening to the board meeting.

### **AFTER**

- Connect with people in the room, talk to some of the organizations there, maybe some board members will hang around.
- 2. Reflect, do you plan on returning to another board meeting, and if not what are your next steps?

Take your time, try to start with a story and slowly input data.


#### **BRING A FRIEND**

The board is headed by Joyce Wilkerson and Wayne Walker. Dr. William Hite is the superintendent of the district. What this means is while the board handles the overarching policies and budget Dr. Hite handles the day to day operation and oversees the function of the district. While Dr. Hite does not vote on any items he can respond to students and is there most of the time.

#### **URBED'S ADVOCACY**

The school board is now a group of members suggested by a committee and appointed by the mayor. It used to be a 5 member board with 3 appointed by the state called the School Reform Commission, UrbEd was key to shifting the control back to Philadelphia for more accountability. UrbEd now advocates for voting student board members to allow real student input. Join the movement for advocating for voting students at
