Disruption in Education


- Technology


Why do your users come to the library?

- Books
 - Read, Issue, Return, Browse, Self-Update, Search, Discover,...
- Periodicals
 - Read, Issue, Return, Browse, Search, Discover,
- Newspapers
 - Read, Browse, Self-update, Search, etc.
- Computers
 - Type, Print, Internet, Connect, Search, Explore, Discover, etc.
- Spaces
 - Carrels, Reading room, Discussion room, Makerspaces, Lounge, Toilets, AC, Safety, Architecture, etc.
- People
 - Other users, Staff, etc.

Why do your users NOT come to the library?

- Digital formats
- Internet / Google
- Perceive it is as not useful / friendly
- Disconnect with educational outcomes like exams, placements, etc
- Does not make a difference
- Afford on their own or own resources
 - Spaces, content, Access, etc
- Teachers do not inspire them to use the library
- Lack of reading habits
