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Rules and Regulations

Attendance and Leave

Every student shall follow strictly the leave rules given under. The Principal will take appropriate action in case of violation of leave rules.

1. No student shall abstain from the classes without prior permission.
2. In case of illness and other unforeseen circumstances, leave application should be handed over to the HOD on the first day of his/her return to the college.
3. A medical certificate should be produced to the Principal in case of leave due to prolonged illness (more than 5 days)
4. A student who absents from the class without any prior permission during any hour of the session will be considered as absent for that session.
5. The attendance certificate which is required for admission to the End Semester Examinations will be granted only if the student's progress and conduct have been satisfactory and the student has attended the required number of working days in that semester.
6. Leave of absence for Practical classes, Cycle tests and Model tests shall be granted if recommended by the staff concerned only.
7. Attendance will be marked for every hour by the staff member concerned.
8. Leaving the campus during class hours is allowed only with the permission of the Principal.

General Discipline

1. Every student should dress decently. Jeans and T Shirts are not allowed.
2. Boys and Girls are instructed not to come to college with painted or coloured hair. The hair should be well groomed neat and tidy.
3. Students shall maintain perfect silence within and outside the classrooms.
4. Students are not allowed to loiter in the corridor during the class hours.
5. Every student should wish the staff members on his / her first meeting of that day.
6. When a staff member enters the class room, the students shall rise up and keep standing till the staff concerned takes his / her seat.
7. Any student who comes to class after the roll call, shall enter the classroom only with the permission of the class teacher concerned.
8. No student shall leave the classroom without the permission of the staff concerned before the class is dispersed.
9. Every student should handle the college property with care and do everything in his / her power to keep the class room clean and maintain the building and the premises spic and span.

10. Smoking and consumption of liquor inside the college campus is strictly prohibited and the offenders will be severely dealt with.
11. The students using two wheelers should wear helmets compulsorily and possess the driving license without which they will not be allowed in the campus.
12. No student shall make the walls untidy or litter papers inside the campus/ classrooms.
13. Students shall conduct themselves with dignity and decorum in all the functions of the college.
14. Students are not allowed to use the mobile phone inside the campus for purposes other than online classes. Mobile phones will be seized from students violating the rules and strict actions will be taken on them.
15. All the students are expected to read the information displayed on the notice board daily and regularly and keep them well informed and ignorance of any information will not be excused.

Eligibility to appear for the End Semester Examinations

A student will be allowed to appear for the end semester examinations only if:

1. He / She procures atleast 75% of attendance.
2. He / She should show satisfactory progress in studies, in all the tests and examinations conducted by the college / department during the semester and secure at least reasonable minimum marks in them.
3. His / Her conduct in the college during the semester is satisfactory.

Shortage of Attendance

The following regulations will be followed for condonation and detention as well:

1. Candidates who earn 75% of attendance and above in the current semester are eligible to write the examinations, both arrears and regular subjects.
2. Candidates who earn attendance between 65% and 74% (both included) in the current semester are eligible to appear for the examination if the shortage of attendance is condoned by the Principal after the payment of the condonation fee prescribed by the University.
3. Candidates who earn attendance between 50% and 64% (both included) in the current semester are not eligible to write examinations in the current semester subjects but are permitted to continue their studies in the next semester provided it is the first time that the candidates have earned attendance between 50% and 64% or else the candidates have to discontinue the course and rejoin in the same semester during next year with the proper approval of the Registrar. However, these candidates are eligible to write the arrears if they have any.

- Candidates who earn attendance below 50% are not eligible to write examinations in the current semester subjects and also have to discontinue the course and rejoin in the same semester in the next year with proper approval of the Registrar. However, these candidates are eligible to write the arrears subjects, if any.
- Candidates who earn attendance between 50% and 64% in the previous semester and have earned combined attendance of 75% or more by taking the average of the attendance earned in the current and the previous semesters are eligible to write semester subjects along with the current semester subjects.

Ragging and Government order on Ragging

Ragging is totally banned in the college and it is a punishable offence. The Government of Tamil Nadu has banned ragging in Educational Institutions by passing an Order "Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act 1997" (vide its order No.7 of 14.02.1997) which says that indulging in ragging will be punished as follows :

- Imprisonment upto a term of 2 years and
- A fine upto Rs.10,000/- and
- The student convicted of ragging will be dismissed from the Institution and shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.

Hence students are advised not to indulge in ragging and stay away from such activities but rise up against this evil.

The committee shall take all necessary and appropriate action to deal with any form of sexual harassment of women at the work place and also for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment subject to the provisions of the said Act as and when any complaint is filed by women employees working in the College. It is to be noted that sexual harassment includes any one or more of the following unwelcome acts and behaviour, whether directly or indirectly, namely:-

1. Physical contact and advances ; or
2. A demand or request for sexual favours; or
3. Making sexually coloured remarks; or
4. Showing pornography; or
5. Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non – verbal conduct of sexual nature.

The committee shall hold office for such period, not exceeding three years from the date of constitution of the committee. If the Presiding Officer or any member ceases to be in our employment, the committee shall have to be reconstituted with suitable replacements. The committee shall have to prepare an annual report and submit the same to the management, on completion of every calendar year.

Transport Facilities

Payment of fees with fine

If a student fails to pay the fees on the date fixed, a fine of ` 5 per working day shall be levied. If the fee is not paid within 20 days from the reopening of the college after the holidays, the student's name shall be removed from the rolls. Absence from college with / without leave letter shall not be the ground for exemption from the operation of this rule. If re-admitted, he / she shall, in addition to fees and fine, pay a re-admission fee of ` 875/- towards Bharathiar University.

Outcome Based Education

“Outcome-Based Education” (OBE) is considered as a student-centred instruction model that focuses on measuring student performance through learning outcomes. Outcomes include knowledge, skills and attitudes. In the OBE model, the required knowledge and skill sets for a particular degree is pre-determined and the students are evaluated for all the required parameters (Outcomes) during the course of the programme.

Swayam

“Swayam” is a programme initiated by the Government of India and designed to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy viz., access, equity and quality. The objective of this effort is to take the best teaching learning resources to all, including the most disadvantaged. Swayam seeks to bridge the digital divide for students, who have hitherto remained untouched by the digital revolution and have not been able to join the mainstream of the knowledge economy. With a focus on establishing quality in education, STC has adopted and implemented Outcome Based Education (OBE) – curriculum design with effect from the academic year 2018-2019.

Evaluation System

Students are evaluated by the continuous Internal Assessment system and the Semester Examinations conducted by the college at the end of the semester under autonomy. Marks for internal assessment is computed based on the marks secured by the student, in Cycle Tests I and II, Model Examinations and Assignment / Seminar, following the norms stipulated by the Bharathiar University or the college. The total marks scored in the Continuous Internal Assessment and semester examinations put together gives the marks scored by a student in the examination of that semester.

Features of Autonomy

Sree Saraswathi Thyagaraja College was awarded Autonomous status by the University Grants Commission and Bharathiar University during the year 2008-09. Autonomy came into force from the academic year 2009-10. All the Under Graduate and Post Graduate students admitted during the Academic year 2009-2010 and thereafter come under autonomous system. With the autonomous status Sree Saraswathi Thyagaraja College has got the freedom to determine and design the curriculum and prescribe its own syllabi and restructure and redesign the course to suit industry needs; prescribe rules for admission in conformity with the reservation policy of the state government.

- Evolve the methods of assessment of student performance, conduct of examinations and declaration of results
- Use modern tools of education technology to achieve higher standards and greater creativity and
- Promote healthy practices such as community service, extension activities, project and programmes for the benefit of the society at large and the neighbourhood.

Towards achieving these objectives Sree Saraswathi Thyagaraja College has constituted Boards of Studies for different disciplines / programmes. Syllabi and scheme of examinations have been framed newly that are being implemented from the Academic year (2009-2010). Office of the Controller of Examinations has been created with Controller of Examinations as the head. Examination Rules and Regulations have been formulated and the salient features of the syllabi and scheme of examinations are:

- Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)
- More industry oriented need based syllabi with greater emphasis on practicals / projects / internship
- Internal assessment as a component of evaluation for 50% marks for I & II (UG & PG), 25% for III Year (UG)
- IDC is introduced from the year 2019-20 for all PG Programmes.
- For all UG Students and PG Students 2 MOOC Courses are compulsory.
- In 2022-23, Credit Transfer is introduced to all PG Programmes apart from MOOC Courses.

Regulations on MOOC

- All Under Graduate (UG) and Post Graduate (PG) students are encouraged to complete two MOOCs [SWAYAM/NPTEL/NSDC] in their UG before completing the fifth semester and likewise two MOOCs [SWAYAM/NPTEL/ NSDC] in PG before completing the third semester.
- The MOOCs, selected by the student from SWAYAM /NPTEL/NSDC, should not be a course that have been already given in their respective curriculum.
- The UG & PG students who do not have entrepreneurship related course in their syllabus should choose one MOOC related to entrepreneurship out of two MOOCs;
- The institute is transferring the equivalent credit earned through [SWAYAM/NPTEL/NSDC] to the students on receipt of MOOCs completion certificate

and these marks/credits shall be incorporated under extra credit course in the overall marksheet of the student.

- The institution will allot a Single Point of Contact (SPoC) who will provide the list of courses offered in the NPTEL/SWAYAM/NSDC platform in the First / Second / Third / Fourth / Fifth semester for UG and similarly the list of courses offered in the NPTEL/SWAYAM/NSDC platform in the First / Second / Third semester for PG.
- A mentor will be allotted based on the domain areas of the students to guide, assist and track the status of progress.
- As per the guidelines of academic council, a 4 weeks course can be considered for 1 credit course, 8 weeks course can be considered for 2 creditcourse and 12 weeks course can be considered for 3 credit course.
- Based on this, the student should complete 2 MOOCs [each of 8 weeks duration] and earn in total 4 credits [2 credits per MOOC].
- The actual marks scored by the student will be taken as it is, in order to incorporate the score in the mark statement, if he/she successfully obtained the certification through MOOC.

Regulations on Credit Transfer (Applicable to PG)

The following credit transfer regulations would come into the force for the PG students admitted in the year 2022-23 and onwards.

- The Credit transfer option has been provided for PG students only.
- Apart from completing 2 MOOCs as extra credit courses, the students are given this option of Credit transfer also;
- For credit transfer, the courses can be selected from NPTEL/SWAYAM/NSDC with the prior approval of the Head of the Department, Dean or Director and the Controller of Examination.
- At least 80 percent of the content of the syllabus from NPTEL/SWAYAM/NSDC should match with the approved elective course contents in IV Semester.
- The institution will allot a Single Point of Contact (SPoC) who will provide the list of courses [with 4 credits] offered in the NPTEL/SWAYAM/NSDC platform in the First / Second / Third semester that can be registered by the student under credit transfer instead of the course that the student has to study in the Fourth semester [preferably elective course – with 4 credits]. This process will enable the student to register for the MOOC well in advance.

- A mentor will be allotted based on the domain areas of the students to guide, assist and track the status of the progress.
- As per the guidelines provided by the academic council a 12 week course can be considered for 3 credit course.
- The actual marks scored by the student will be taken as it is, in order to provide the score in the mark statement, if he/she successfully obtains the certification through MOOC.
- If a student has successfully completed the course in NPTEL/SWAYAM/NSDC, then the marks obtained and the appropriate credits will be informed by the SPoC to the Office of the Controller of Examinations (CoE). The marks and its corresponding grade may change as per the CBCS guidelines and regulations of the corresponding programme.
- If the student is not able to complete the MOOCs for credit transfer purpose before third semester, then the student can proceed to study the course offered in IV Semester.
- An exclusive monitoring committee will be constituted to supervise the 80% syllabus content matching and ensure the smooth conduct of the credit transfer process. The committee will resolve any issues that may arise in the implementation of the regulations from time to time. The committee will have the following composition:
 - ? The Principal as the Chair Person
 - ? Single Point of Contact (SPoC) as a Member
 - ? Controller of Examinations as Member Secretary
 - ? One Member from the School of Computing Science
 - ? One Member from the School of Management Studies
 - ? One Member from the School of Commerce
 - ? One Member from Science, Humanities and Social Studies (Consists of Tamil, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Social Works, and Psychology).

Syllabus coverage

The coverage of syllabus unit-wise will be strictly followed as scheduled in the calendar except for some deviations in respect of students of 1 year UG and PG courses for whom classes commence normally at a later date.

IQAC

An Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was established in 2007 as per the guidelines of NAAC to ensure quality education through various quality measures. The IQAC is mandated to pursue its goal of enhanced activities in the campus with respect to performance evaluation, assessment and accreditation and quality up-gradation.

As quality enhancement is a continuous process, IQAC plays an important role in the institution's system and works towards the realization of the goals of quality enhancement and sustenance. The prime task of IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of the institution. For this, during the post-accreditation period, IQAC would channelize all efforts and measures of the institution towards promoting holistic academic excellence. The work of the IQAC is primarily to step towards internalization and Institutionalization of quality enhancement initiatives. Its success depends on the sense of belongingness and participation of stakeholders. It is not yet another hierarchical structure or a record-keeping organ in the institution; but, it acts as a facilitator and participative voluntary system of the institution. During the academic year, the IQAC has conducted four meetings and the minutes and action taken reports have been recorded properly.

Hostel

The warden will carry out the administration of the college hostels. The hostel rules are applicable to all the residents of the hostel and Principal's interpretation of the rules shall be final and binding.

Hostel Rules and Regulations

GENERAL

1. The students are allowed to go out of the hostel only with the permission of the warden. Once the students have come back, they should inform the warden immediately.
2. Students are not allowed to conduct meeting or give notice or collect money from other students for any purpose or any kind of activity.
3. Students are not allowed to stick pictures, draw or write on the walls.
4. If the hostel's property is damaged, penalty fees towards damages will be collected from the students.
5. Day scholar students will not be permitted to enter the hostel under any circumstance.

6. Hostel will remain closed on important occasions like Deepavali, Pongal festival etc.,
7. Students should report everyday to the hostel warden before 6 pm either he/she comes from the college or residence.
8. Hostel will be closed during vacation.
9. Students are allowed to go out of the hostel on Sundays from 8 am to 1 pm.
10. A Student movement register is maintained for documentation purpose.

FEES

Hostel / Mess fees should be paid per annum and it will not be refunded for any reason.

MESS

1. All the students should follow the specified time fixed for taking food.
2. Food materials from the mess shall not be taken to the room or outside on any account.

WATER

1. Due to acute water shortage inmates are instructed to avoid wastage of water and water supply will be regulated if necessary.

ELECTRICITY

1. Power supply will be regulated if necessary. The cost of running the generator will be shared by the inmates on pro rata basis, and electricity charges should be paid at the end of the semester.
2. Students are instructed not to use any electronic instruments like radio, iron box, heater etc., in their rooms and use the facilities, fans and lights etc., judiciously. Students are required to follow the rules & regulations prescribed from time to time very strictly.
3. In all matters, the decision of the Principal shall be final and binding.

Industry Visits

The University Grants Commission views that mere class room learning is insufficient and cannot complete the learning process. The students are frequently

given in-house and on-the-job training and the departments should organise industry visits for students so that they can get first-hand information and exposure to corporate practices and industrial activities. Such visits are organised with the complete knowledge and permission of the parents of the wards.

National Service Scheme

Three units of National Service Scheme (NSS) are functioning in the college with several volunteers under three Programme officers. The NSS volunteers are rendering creditable services in several villages, orphanages and old age homes by conducting blood donation camps, immunization programmes, sanitation programmes, adult education, health care camps and AIDS awareness programmes. One unit of the Youth Red Cross is also functioning effectively in the college.

National Cadet Corps

STC is proud to have established National Cadet Corps (NCC) Army Wing in the campus. It was inaugurated at STC on Nov 15, 2019 by Lt. Col. Girish Parthan, SM, Officer Commanding, 2 (TN) Battery NCC, Coimbatore. The National Cadet Corps is the young wing of Armed Forces with its headquarters in New Delhi. It is open to school and college students on voluntary basis. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms and drills in order to groom the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. In addition several periodicals being procured in CD-ROM form are also available. The Digital Library of the college has about 2758 CDs, floppies and cassettes. Question papers of the University examinations and all back volumes of the journals are made available for reference. The DELNET (Developing Library Net Work), INFLIBNET – N – List provides 3,02,15,004 books and 48184 +E – journals. Database has been subscribed for the benefit of the students and staff. The DELNET provides 38184 E-journals, plenty of E-books on various subjects & statistical data base for researchers and 1124250 articles which help the members to find their references. An exclusive Library for Commerce and Management has been established recently.
