- Requirements for elected Directors to obtain a Director's ID, according to the CATSI act.

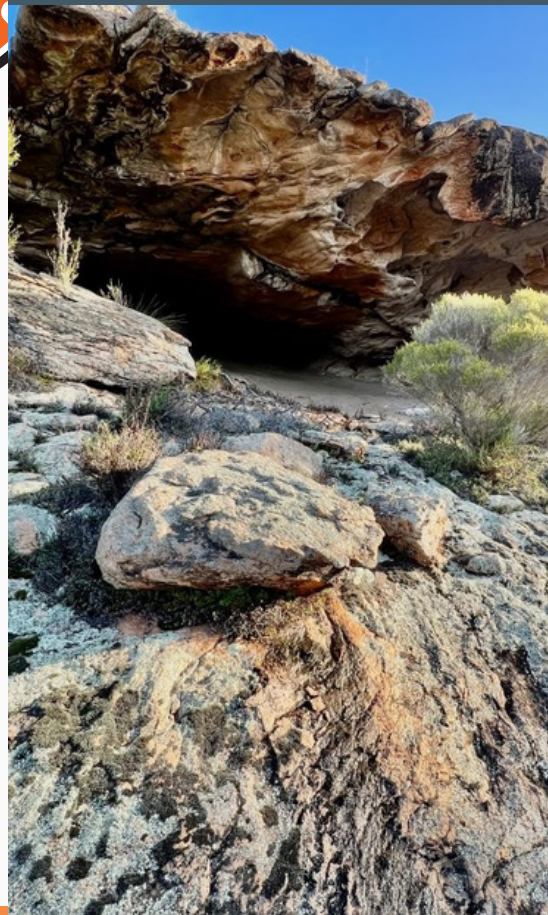


YARNING CIRCLES:

- NNTAC completed 44 Surveys and/or Monitoring fieldwork during the 2022 fieldwork season.
- There were approx. 72 Ngadju Survey Participants involved during the 44 Surveys and/or Monitoring.
