Ngadju Native Title Aboriginal Corporation RNTBC (NNTAC) is the prescribed body corporate that holds the native title rights and interests on trust for the Ngadju people. The Ngadju people's native title rights and interests, including the right to maintain and protect important places, were recognised by the Federal Court of Australia in 2014 and 2017 (**Ngadju Determination**).

NNTAC intends to apply to the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Council to carry out the functions of a Local Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Service under the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act* 2021 (Western Australia).

To assist NNTAC in carrying out these responsibilities, we are seeking to expand our panel of heritage consultants and invite expressions of interest (EOI) from suitably qualified anthropologists and archaeologists, and consulting firms who engage such professionals. Consultants must demonstrate in their EOI relevant experience working with native title holders in the conduct of cultural mapping or heritage surveys.
