Engagement in the Music Program will improve the quality of perception and self-expression by fostering the acquisition of musical skills, thereby increasing aesthetic sensibility, cultural awareness, and social-emotional engagement.

From the beginning of their music journey at Marcellin, Year 7 students are offered multiple opportunities to engage in either individual or small group instrumental tuition, and a performing band, orchestra or ensemble. Together with our exceptional music staff, students journey through a collaborative, cross-generational experience of music making and performance that not only enriches their learning, but also that of the wider school community.

Instrumental tuition is available across brass, woodwind, strings, drums and percussion, guitar, piano and keyboard, voice, public speaking, acting, music theory, and music technology.

Ensembles consist of Junior, Intermediate and Senior Concert bands, Jazz Bands, String ensembles, Rock / Soul / New Orleans Bands and more.

Annual performance opportunities consist of everything from major whole-school liturgical events to soiree nights, jazz, classical and junior concerts, and public festivals and competitions.
