Simply and Easy Tips

If you want to recycle well, but don't have time for details, **keep it simple** by following three basic instructions:

- Empty, Clean, and Loose. Paper products, metal and plastic containers should be empty, clean, and loose so they can be successfully processed by our recycler.
- Qualtiy plastic bottles, jugs, jars, and tubs only.
 Flimsy plastics, thick plastics, plastic bags and films can NOT be recycled in your blue cart. Also, no black or multi-colored plastic, even if it has the right recycling number.
- When in doubt, throw it out. Avoid "wish-cycling." If you have time and interest to get the most accurate information about what do do with each item specifically, including hard-to-recycle items, read detailed guide on the following pages.

Where and When to Repair, Recycle, Reuse, and Compost...

GLASS		TO KNOW
Bottles and jars of any color, shape, size (intact)	BB	Rinse out. No need to remove labels. Separate metal lids.
Light bulbs (compact fluorescent, non-working)	DR	Drop off at 2 or 24 . Place in zipper type bags for safety.
Light bulbs (incandescent, non-working)	TR	If still working, please reuse or give away. If not, toss.
Broken glass (including bottles, jars, windows, mirrors, etc.)	TR	Be careful handling. Wrap in other discardable material.
Glass drinkware (intact, useable glasses, mugs, etc.) 💩 😖	DR	Donate locally or call Simple Recycling for pickup.
Window glass or mirrors (good condition)	DR	Drop off at 12 (phone ahead to confirm acceptance).
METAL		
Cans of any kind	BB	No need to remove plastic or paper wrappers.
Metal lids larger than 3" across	BB	Under 3" lids need to go in the trash! Please don't combine.
Empty aerosol cans	BB	Make sure it's completely empty! If not, needs to go to 24 .
Aluminum foil, plates and trays (without burn or food residue) 🛛 👊	B	Flatten it (not balls). Be sure it's clean! If not, you have to toss it.
Aluminum foil, plates and trays with burns or food residue	■ R	Reuse as long as possible. Then toss.
Foil seals from yogurt, etc.	₩.	As much as we'd like to save these, they won't be saved.
Scrap metal, metal hangers, damaged pots and pans, etc.	DR	Leave in alley for scrappers or drop off at 26 (phone ahead).
Large appliances (working or very nearly so)	DR	Drop off at 12 or 23 (phone ahead to confirm acceptance).
Large appliances (in bad repair)	DR	Drop at 25 (fee applies) or call 847-448-4311 for removal by 27 .
PLASTIC		
Containers with #1, #2, and #5 (except black or mixed color)	BB	Rinse food/liquids. Remove shrink-wrap labels. Put lids on.
Plastic cups labeled #6 (e.g. Solo Cups)	DR	Throw out, or you can save up cups and lids and drop off at 18
Other plastics labeled #6 (e.g., Styrofoam containers)	DR	Generally waste. However Mt. Prospect has begun to accept.
Plastics labeled #3, #4, #7 or with no label #	TR	Do NOT "wish-cycle" these. It contaminates the useful plastic.
Polylactide (PLA) containers (if certified by <u>CMA-W</u> or <u>BPI</u>)	CR	Compost with Collective Resource only. NOT yard or blue bins
Takeout container (#1 #2 or #5) (except black or mixed color)	BB	Rinse out food. Put lids on. Do <u>not</u> recycle black or mixed colo
Clamshell container (#1 #2 or #5) (except black or mixed color)	BB	Rinse off food or liquids. Shut lid. <u>Not</u> black or mixed color.
Pill/Vitamin Containers (#1 #2 or #5)	BB	Empty them.
Plastic bags, films, and labels (shopping, bread, produce, wrap)	DR	Drop off at 15.
Rigid thick plastic (tubes, flower pot, nursery tray, toy, etc.)	TR	These can \underline{NOT} be recycled even if they are marked with a #.
Spray bottles/dispensers (#1-5 or 7)	BB	Rinse thoroughly. Separate #s. Toss #6 or un-numbered.
Candy wrappers	DR	Throw out or save them up and drop off at 18.
Flexible Plastic Pouches and Coffee Pods	TR	Don't contaminate the good stuff!
Foam packaging (styrofoam chunks, not peanuts)	DR	Drop off at 23.

Packing peanuts—Styrofoam	Pure waste.
Plastic condiment packets and plastic cutlery	100% waste. Ask restaurants not to send.
Six pack and 12 pack rings	Total waste. Chop up to save the fish.
Lids not attached to their containers	These small things clog up the recycling system. Must be attached.
Reusable shopping bags	Reuse these as along as possible. They are NOT recyclable.
Campaign signs	Consider repurposing as poster-board, but do NOT recycle.

Newspaper © (a)	Remove bags/bands. Do NOT compost in city yard bin.
Junk mail, magazines, catalogs, phone books, and paperbacks	Open to ensure no plastic. Do NOT compost in city yard bin.
Office paper (used, any color, incl. envelopes) 🕫 💿 (Don't recyle if shredded, but you can compost shredded w/CR.
Cardboard boxes, tubes, shoeboxes 🙃 🙃	Remove shredded paper. Do NOT compost in city yard bin.

Bakery bag/box w/plastic "window"	Rinse food. Remove/toss plastic. Do NOT compost in city bin.
Milk, juice, broth, soup, wine cartons	Rinse food or liquids. Put lids on. Do NOT compost in city bin.
Cardboard with Food (Pizza boxes, etc.)	Compost with Collective Resource only, not in city bins or bags.
Cardboard egg cartons Gift bags	Can put in City recycling or compost with Collective Resource. Remove foil and plastic 'bling' from gift bags.
CMA-W- or BPI-certified compostable plates, kitchenware, napkins, etc. Microwave popcorn bags Coffee filters Masking tape (Blue only) Shredded paper (only in small amounts used as a liner in compost bin)	© Compost with Collective Resource only, not in city bins or bags.

Saving and Sharing Edible Food

One of the most frustrating wastes in modern life is when we have to throw out "perfectly good food." The flow chart below offers guidance about what to do with excess food from your home or event. To the right, we list local food donation recipients, and share some related resources. Remember...

- Not all food is safe for donation. Please protect health and obey laws.*
- Recipients know their needs. So, call/email to confirm, then respect their wishes.
- You can still avoid a total waste by composting instead of tossing.

	IF YOU HAVE THIS	THEN TRY THIS
1	Packaged food that is unopened, with a clearly marked use-by date that is still in the future.	Contact first, then bring to a food pantry . Email or call ahead to confirm if/when/how they accept). OR, you can check to confirm that it meets <u>donation</u> <u>guidelines</u> then deliver to a community fridge .
2	 Larger quantities of food that would feed 10+ people, From a caterer, restaurant, or deli that has been prepared and packed safely and is unopened OR Fresh fruit, vegetables, pastries, bread, or eggs (in a carton that has a valid use-by date) 	Contact first, then bring to a shelter . Email or call ahead to confirm if/when/how they accept. OR, if they cannnot accept the food, divide into smaller, portions, clearly label those portions per donation guidelines and deliver to a community fridge or post on mutual aid group such as Freecycle or Buy Nothing Project.
3	Smaller quantities of obviously fresh, safe, edible food including clearly labeled containers of leftovers that are NOT raw meat, raw fish or an <i>opened</i> container of a condiment, liquid, or sauce.	Confirm that it meets <u>donation guidelines</u> then label clearly and deliver to a community fridge .
4	Other safe, fresh, edible food that does not meet the criteria above (opened, raw, undated, etc.)	Give directly to friends or neighbors, or post on mutual aid group such as <u>Freecycle</u> or <u>Buy Nothing Project</u> .
5	None of the above is true, or you've tried all the other ways to share your food.	Remove packaging and compost. See p. 10 for composting options and guidelines.

- 1 At the annual Evanston Recycles Event, held in the first week of July each year, only electronics, unused and expired medications (in labeled bottles, no syringes), and paper documents for shredding (up to 5 bankers' boxes with all metal removed) are accepted. No HH chemicals.
- 2 The Rebuilding Exchange does not accept the following materials: liquid/semi-liquid materials (paint, stain, cleaners, grout, caulk, etc), lightbulbs, fluorescent light fixtures, fabric-based materials (beds, sofas, loungers, carpet, etc), pipes, electrical wiring, and insulation.)
- 3 Check web site first. Only open on Thursdays, 2pm-7pm and 1st Saturday of month: 8am-3pm.
- 4 Check web site first. Limited hours for electronics recycling. Saturdays 9-11:30a.
