
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Overview: Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program



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What YHDP Requires:

- Creating a comprehensive plan to address youth homelessness in the community
- Developing partnerships with RHY providers, child welfare, education, juvenile justice, and many others
- Creating and implementing innovative projects to address youth homelessness, including diversion, host homes, RRH, youth navigators, etc.

What Communities Gain:


- In-depth technical assistance to help develop the coordinated community plan and projects
- Enhanced ability to ask for waivers of regulatory and statutory requirements under the CoC program
- Concentrated funding to focus on addressing and ending youth homelessness in the community
 - Funding can be renewed as a CoC project at the end of the two-year YHDP projects



Overview: Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program

Innovative projects:

- System navigators, including youth navigators
- Joint TH-RRH
- Rapid Rehousing for 36 months
- Diversion
- · Partnerships with Public Child Welfare Agencies (PCWAs), Higher Education, Justice



Discussion About Data

Questions to consider at the community level:

- What are some youth-specific factors that are important for understanding youth homelessness?
- How can these be best measured?
- To what extent are these being measured (anywhere)?
- What is your experience in measuring any of these?
- How could these factors be captured in your community?
- Are experiences of youth currently or previously experiencing homelessness incorporated in your data collection and analysis efforts?





Discussion About Data

HMIS is not the only data source for evaluating YHDP projects or the program as a whole – but it is the primary way performance is reported to HUD.

What is the best way to represent the performance of YHDP projects in HMIS?

- Well-defined programs
- Proper project application and setup
- Clear data collection requirements
- Ongoing data quality evaluation





Sharing YHDP Data

- Demonstration program=responsibility to share performance data, promising practices, and lessons learned
- Data sources:
 - Comprehensive evaluation of Round 1 (FY2016) communities- Westat
 - YHDP Summary Report
 - Looks at project performance using APR and YHDP supplemental data
 - Current iteration includes data from Round 1 years 1&2 and Round 2 year 1
 - Intent is to repeat annually as new data are available
 - Accompanying briefs that take a deep dive into select topics
 - Stella-P
 - All Child & Youth" households as a population group instead of "Child Only Households
 - Stella M coming soon!
 - Quarterly data reports (forthcoming)
 - Qualitative data collection from YHDP communities (forthcoming)





YHDP Annual Reporting

- YHDP grants are required to report annually through the Annual Performance Report
- The YHDP APR contains many unique elements
 - YHDP Supplemental Reporting Questions
 - Waivers
 - Demonstration Outcomes
 - Persons Served
 - Diversion
 - Host Homes/Shared Housing
 - YHDP Supplemental Reporting CSV
 - RHY Elements: R3 Required, other RHY elements optional
 - C3 Education Element
 - Cross-tabulations allow for an intersectional view of the data to better understand equity in access and outcomes



Equity

Equity in Access

- Race: YHDP serves higher rates of youth of color than the CoC Program. Both rates are higher than the PIT count
- Ethnicity: YHDP serves a higher rate of Hispanic youth than the CoC program. Both rates are lower than the PIT count (though YHDP much closer)
- Gender and Sexual Orientation: No findings

Equity in Outcomes

- YHDP outcomes measured for different groupings based on race, ethnicity, gender, and sexual orientation
- No consistent inequity was found across the board
- Specific instances of high inequity were found;
 more research is required to understand these instances
 - Ex. Housing outcomes for white youth in Round 2(73%) were much higher than youth of color counterparts (48%)




