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## A Movement Built on Counting Up

We designed the 100,000 Homes Campaign to help communities reach a large, aggregate housing total together. Only one metric mattered: monthly housing placements. The 100,000 Homes Campaign proved that communities could increase their housing placement rates, but this did not automatically reduce homelessness.








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## The Pivot to Counting Down

You can't measure an end to homelessness by counting up. Instead, focus on the outcome measure (ex: # of people experiencing homelessness) and count down.

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# BY-NAME, REAL-TIME DATA



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## Defining a Quality By-Name List

#### **FULL COVERAGE**

PERSON-LEVEL DATA

**RELIABILITY** 

**REGULAR UPDATES** 

- All agencies and programs are represented
- List includes people sleeping in shelters and on the streets
- Each person has an entry that includes their name, history, health and housing needs
- Each person can be followed through the system
- Data balances month over month, just like your checkbook
- List is updated monthly, at a minimum, not PIT
- As people's housing status changes, so do their list entries



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## Benefits of a By-Name List

## IMPROVED SYSTEMS

## RESOURCE ADVOCACY

- Target limited housing resources to the most vulnerable individuals and families
- Stretch resources further by connecting people to the most cost effective support to meet their needs
- Use aggregate data to see trends, flag bottlenecks, and identify improvement opportunities across your system
- Test new strategies and know quickly whether your efforts are reducing homelessness
- Ground your advocacy in concrete data
- Use monthly data trends to make stable projections and quantify your projected resource gaps



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


#### Actively Homeless Population Monthly count for Chronic subpopulation(s)

Achieved an end to veteran homelessness in September 2015!










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## Lake County, IL

Achieved an end to veteran homelessness in December 2018!


Actively Homeless Population Monthly count for Veteran subpopulation(s)

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## Why Study Sustainability?


- Identify ongoing resource investments needed to maintain an end to homelessness over time
- Quantify the value of doing systems work
- Understand nature of inflow
- Test how homelessness might be ended for multiple populations at once
- Help the public believe an end to homelessness is really possible

A 3 month look-back period could provide a more detailed picture:








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

How does length of time from ID to housing figure in?












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
## **Emerging Considerations**

Balancing responsiveness with a low active homeless number













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## Primary activities of sustaining

- Ensuring housing retention
- Tracking when temporary subsidies expire, accounting for resources to transition to permanent for some
- Progressive engagement
- Maintain relationships with landlords, property managers, etc.
- Ensuring flexibility to absorb unexpected inflow for veterans
- Managing at "at-risk" list for chronic, enacting related policies
- Plan for resource needs based on current stability and expected inflow
