

Members of the Association were enormously pleased to learn that our most distinguished life member, Alan Wale, was awarded an Order of Australia (OAM) in this year's Queen's Birthday Honours list.

Along with Leon Sadubin and Les Miller, Alan founded our association in 1978.

Alan also established the Sturt School for Wood in Mittagong in 1985. He was also the Founding Director, at the Cheltenham Craft Centre, from 1974 to 1980, a lecturer on various woodwork topics at the University of the Third Age and a woodwork craftsman and

artisan of outstanding skill for many years.

Dr Rodney Hayward, from ANU's School of Art, said of Alan:

"In his teaching he passed on the vital directness of how wood could be worked: the tacit understanding of the sharp tool accurately, deftly, working sweet wood.

"From the material, the hands and the tools came the design. He loves the directness of the crafts of the cooper, the bodger and the wheelwright. This was part of the lineage he passed on to his students—the passion and the knowledge discovered from an edge tool working sweet wood.



French polishing course

A French polishing course was arranged by our committee at the Lidcombe TAFE during the first few weeks of June.

It was held in one of the Lidcombe TAFE's purpose-built furniture finishing "class rooms".

Under the expert guidance of the very experienced and knowledgeable TAFE tutor Dave Marks, we learnt how shellac is made from sticklac, how to mix and then apply French polish using swooges, brushes and rubbers.

The course was very hands-on and included applying swooge coats of French polish and then skinning in the polish to fill the grain in the timber.

This was followed by the bodying up process using pumice and mineral oil and then finally stiffing up to achieve a bright and shiny surface. Everyone French-polished three or four timber panels.

We also received an overview on grain filling as well as staining timber with dyes and pigments prior to applying French polish.

Overall it was an enjoyable and stimulating course which provided us with the knowledge and confidence to use French polish as a finish, where appropriate, on future projects.


