- Keep in mind, the greater the contrast between words and paper, the easier it is for elders to read.
- Ask children to **sign their first name** to the cards. Names are more personal, but not required.
- Feel free to include, on the cards, the name of the agency, school or group from which the cards are being donated.
- Consider donating more than one card/artwork per child.
- Submit cards by <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>December 14th</u>.
