Les Manoirs des Portes de Deauville: The four- star Boutique Hotel in Normandy



Located a few kilometres away from the hustle and bustle of Deauville, four-star hotel Les Manoirs des Portes de Deauville is set to open on July 1st, just in time for summer.

The soon-to-open hotel is ideally situated 2 hours away from Paris, on the outskirts of the upscale seaside town of Deauville – a famous weekend retreat for Parisians – so that guests can enjoy the beach as well as the tranquillity and charm of the Norman countryside. Set on a stunning 2-hectar park, the hotel includes one main manor house, nine cottages, an orchard and a pond, a relaxation area with a pool house, an outdoor heated pool, a sauna and a jacuzzi; making it the perfect getaway to relax and unwind – all the while enjoying everything the region has to offer.

Known for its culinary delicacies – including Norman cheese, like the world-famous Camembert, Calvados alcohol and seafood – Normandy and its abundance of delicious restaurants and food markets, not to mention the fishermen town of Trouville, will not disappoint foodie travellers. Horse racers enthusiasts will also be pleased, as the hotel is located nearby the renowned Deauville La Touques Hippodrome. Other local landmarks include the Casino Barrière (with 203 slot machines and 9 gaming tables), Deauvillés large sandy beach bordered by Les Planches, a boardwalk dating back to the 1920's, made internationally famous in 1966 by the Claude Lellouchés film "Un homme et une femme"; as well as high-end shopping and the American film festival.

Les Manoirs des Portes de Deauville offers privacy and relaxation, with its 27 accommodation units, spread across the manor and cottages, each carefully decorated in a comfortable yet minimalist style. Some of them have their own kitchenette as well as a breath-taking view of the garden.

The hotel also has a cosy honesty bar, designed to look and feel welcoming thanks to its interior, which blends velvet with cane work and black wood and features bistro tables encircled with brass. For some extra cocooning during colder nights, small lounges are set around a large central fireplace. In the morning this space transforms itself into a convivial breakfast room, where traditional French pastries and breads, as well as seasonal fruits and local produce are served daily.

Whilst the décor remains modern and simple, the structure itself, with its exposed beams and authentic Norman half-timbered and thatched exterior, is reminiscent of its rich history. The building, which is an 16th and 17th century manor and a registered historical building, was formerly called Le Manoir de Prétot and belonged to none other than Marie Corneille, the sister of French tragedian Pierre Corneille. Today, it has become a pleasant link between the past and the present.

Open all year-round, Les Manoirs des Portes de Deauville is already taking bookings.

How to get there: From London - direct flights from Stansted to Deauville airport with Ryanair, then a 12-minute drive to the hotel.

Ferry from Portsmouth to Ouistreham, then a 20-minuste drive to the hotel.

From Paris – 2h30 drive or 2h direct train ride from Paris Saint Lazare station, the a 10-minute drive from Deauville-Trouville train station.

Rooms: 27 rooms, including 1 single room (16m²), 12 double rooms (18 to 30m²), 3 private cottages (22 to 42m²) and 11 suites (29 to 47m²).

Prices: double room from 120€ during low season and from 390€ during high season



Buffet breakfast: From 7h30 until 11 am, fresh fruit, fresh fruit juice, cheese, cereals, eggs, hot drinks, viennoiseries, brioches, different breads and local products.
