At your request I shall try my best to give a quick synopsis of my experence with the legal system, and the I.R.S..

In 1980 I was forced into backruptcy for various reasons. At this time I fell behind in my with-holdings for appro. \$130,000.00. For 10 years I went around and around with the I.R.S. to no prevail. In 1980 I hired an Attorney, here in Modesto, one that knew less than me about I.R.S..I had been served papers and had to go to court, this Att. represented me, and of coursr now I see it vary plan, they are all one. March and April the trial went on. just right for a big splash befor April 15th. After it was over I had spent about \$150,000.00 for att. fees and appeals. I was given 4 years in medium high securty at Sheridon, Or. and 3 years probation.

That's all come and gone now. in 2002 I met up with the Freedom law school, I needed some help. I had had enough of the legal system. The Justice was after me again. They want to ament the original Judgment and include all the family property. Peymon and Ed Bruning got on the phone with each other and said they could help. So whats \$7000.00 compared to \$150,000.00.I said lets get stared. Inabout 2 months the Justice Dept. with drew it's complaint. At the same time the I.R.S. liened me again, well Mr. Bruning says great. Now they have to give us a hearing.

Don't tell me these guys arn't the greated. Some times, one has to look the enemy in the eye, and smell it's vile breath to to finally get the message. You bet I'll support the Freedom Law School.
