## CAREER HIGHLIGHT: UX DESIGNER

User experience (UX) designers work on making sure applications and websites are enjoyable and easy to use for individual users. They are involved in the design of digital products and services, such as apps and websites, for specific target groups and users. In this role, you'll perform several tasks including sketching concepts, redesigning websites, creating mobile apps, and creating prototypes.

The technology industry is booming in the North East and is home to software and technology companies operating across the globe. The industry is growing and there is a constant need for skilled and talented individuals, so there is ample opportunity in the region to excel as a UX designer.

Some skills that would help in a role such as a UX designer would include communication, computer literacy, flexibility and adaptability, design, and spatial awareness. Whether you are working on your own, or as part of a team, you need to be able to gauge how usable a website is and adapt it where necessary.

### WHAT TO DO AFTER SCHOOL



#### A Levels

With A Levels, you can carry on studying subjects you took for GCSE to a higher level, or pick new ones you may not have done before such as Law or Psychology.

You study A Levels for 2 years, and usually take exams at the end of the course.

To take A Levels, you usually need 5 GCSE's grade 5 or above, including English and Maths, and they can lead to university or college courses, higher and degree apprenticeships, and work.

#### T Levels

T Levels are designed in partnership with employers to give you the skills and knowledge to get on in the workplace. You'll combine classroom learning with real work placements. A T Level is the equivalent of 3 A levels. You study T Levels for 2 years, and there is a mix of exams, projects and practical assignments.

Entry requirements depend on the course you want to take, so this would need to be looked at independently. T
